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RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 3211.

TO PAVE "B" STREET FROM THE WEST LINE OF FOURTH
STREET TO A POINT 25 FEET EAST OF THE EAST LINE
OF CALIFORNIA STREET; AND TO CONSTRUCT CULVERTS
AND "GUTTER BRIDGES" AND CONCRETE CURBS THEREON,
AND UPON STREETS INTERSECTING THEREWITH; ALL
BETWEEN THE POINTS HEREINBEFORE MENTIONED.

RESOLVED, that it is the intention of the Common Council of the City of San Diego, a municipal corporation in the County of San Diego, State of California, to order the following street work to be done in said city, to-wit:

That the roadway of "B" Street from the west line of Fourth street to a point 25 feet east of the east line of California Street, in the City of San Diego, California, including the entire width of said roadway from curb line to curb line, and including the intersections of "B" Street with all streets intersecting therewith between the west line of Fourth Street and a point 25 feet east of the east line of California Street, from curb line to curb line of said intersections, (excepting such portions of said "B" Street and the said intersections of streets therewith, between said points required by law, to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon) be paved with asphalt pavement on an asphalt concrete base, according to the drawings and cross-sections therefor hereinafter more particularly identified and according to the specifications and explanatory notes therefor accompanying said drawings and cross-sections and according to the specifications contained in Ordinance No.1129 of the ordinances of said city, entitled, "An Ordinance Prescribing Specifications for Asphalt Pavement on Asphalt Concrete Base in the City of San Diego, California," approved June 3rd, 1902, and in Ordinance No.2187 of the ordinances of said city, approved October 23rd, 1905, and entitled, "An Ordinance Amending Section 2 and Section 7 of Ordinance No.1129 of the Ordinances of the City of San Diego, Approved on the 3rd day of June, 1902, and Repealing Ordinance No.1147, Approved on the 17th day of June, 1902."

Provided, however, that as to those parts of said "B" street and said intersections of streets therewith to be occupied by the culverts hereinafter provided for, the concrete base of said pavement shall terminate where it joins said culverts as shown by the drawings for said culverts, which drawings are hereinafter more particularly identified (said base being identified upon said drawings by the words "asphaltic concrete"), and the asphalt surface of said pavement shall be continued over said culverts and beyond the curb lines of said "B" street, and of said intersections of streets therewith, to the extent as shown by, and in the manner and all in accordance with, the said drawings for said culverts (said asphalt surface being identified on said drawings, viz, "Asphaltum 2").

And provided that as to those parts of said "B" street and said intersections of streets therewith to be occupied by the "gutter bridges" hereinafter provided for, the said pavement shall terminate where it joins said gutter bridges, as shown by the drawings for said gutter bridges, which drawings are hereinafter more particularly identified.

Also, that there be constructed on said "B" street between said west line of Fourth street and a point 25 feet east of the east line of California street, and upon the intersections of streets with "B" Street and streets intersecting "B" Street between Fourth Street and a point 25 feet east of the east line of California Street, all the culverts with their appurtenances shown by the drawings for culverts hereinafter more particularly

identified; that each of said culverts with its appurtenances be located at the place where it is by said drawings shown to be located and, together with its appurtenances, be constructed of the materials and of the size and shape, and in all respects according to, and in the manner required by, said drawings, including the typical drawings for culverts, hereinafter more particularly identified, and in accordance with the general specifications and explanatory notes for culverts and their appurtenances accompanying said drawings, and in accordance with the ordinances referred to in the general specifications accompanying said drawings, to-wit, the ordinances Nos.1129 and 2187 hereinbefore more particularly identified, as said ordinances are modified by said specifications accompanying said drawings (excepting that such portions of said culverts, or of any of them, or of their appurtenances, located in that portion of said "B" Street or said streets intersecting "B" street or said intersections of streets required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon, shall not be constructed by authority of this resolution or included as a part of the work to be done hereunder).

Also that there be constructed on said "B" Street, between the said west line of Fourth Street and a point 25 feet east of the east line of California Street, and upon the intersections of streets therewith between said points, all the "Gutter Bridges" with their appurtenances shown by the drawings for said gutter bridges hereinafter more particularly identified; that each of said gutter bridges with its appurtenances be located at the place where it is by said drawings shown to be located and, together with its appurtenances, be constructed of the materials and of the size and shape and in all respects according to, and in the manner required by, said drawings and in accordance with the general specifications and explanatory notes for gutter bridges and their appurtenances accompanying said drawings, and in accordance with the ordinance referrred to in said general specifications, to wit: Ordinance No.2763 of the ordinances of said City of San Diego, California, entitled, "An Ordinance Providing Specifications for Asphalt Macadam Pavement in the City of San Diego, california," approved on the 14th day of February, 1907, (excepting that such portions of said gutter bridges, or of any of them or their appurtenances, located in that part of said "B" street or said intersections of streets required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon, shall not be constructed by authority of this resolution or included as a part of the work done hereunder).

The aforesaid drawings and cross-sections, with the specifications and explanatory notes accompanying the same, for said paving and aforesaid drawings and typical drawings, with the general specifications and explanatory notes accompanying the same, for said culverts and their appurtenances, and the aforesaid drawings, with the general specifications and explanatory notes accompanying the same, for the said gutter bridges and their appurtenances; are contained in that certain document on file in the office of the clerk of said city and endorsed as follows, to wit: Document No. 16387 Filed Feb 25 1907 J.T.Butler City Clerk, By Percy L.Day, Deputy, Communication from City Engineer Plans & cross-sections for paving 'B' street from 4th to California streets. Presented to Common Council and ordered Filed 2/25/07", and copies of the same are on file in the office of the engineer of said city, and all the drawings, cross-sections and typical drawings, with the specifications and explanatory notes accompanying the same and contained in said Document No.16387, are hereby approved and adopted as the drawings, cross-sections and specifications to be followed in connection with the other specifications herein referred to in the construction of said culverts and gutter bridges and their appertaining structures as shown thereby and in

the paving of said "B" street and said intersections of streets therewith, and by reference thereto all said drawings, cross-sections, typical drawings and specifications and explanatory notes accompanying the same, contained in said Document No.16387, and said Ordinances Nos. 2763, 1129 and 2187 are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

And said work shall include grading and preparing the roadbed, trenching for culverts, and all other things required by said Ordinances Nos. 2763, 1129 and 2187 and shown by the contents of said Document No. 16387 to be necessary for the construction of said culverts and their appurtenances, and the laying of said pavement, in accordance therewith.

TO PAVE "C" STREET FROM THE EAST LINE OF SIXTH STREET TO THE WEST LINE OF TWELFTH STREET, AND TO CONSTRUCT CULVERTS AND CONCRETE CURBS THEREON AND UPON STREETS INTERSECTING THEREWITH, ALL BETWEEN THE POINTS HEREINBEFORE MENTIONED.

RESOLVED, that it is the intention of the Common Council of the City of San Diego, a municipal corporation in the County of San Diego, State of California, to order the following street work to be done in said city, to wit:

That the roadway of "C" street from the east line of Sixth street to the west line of Twelfth street, in the City of San Diego, California, including the entire width of said roadway from curb line to curb line, and including the intersections of "C" street with all streets intersecting therewith between the east line of Sixth street and the west line of Twelfth street, from curb line to curb line of said intersections, (excepting such portions of said "C" street and the said Intersections of streets therewith, between said points, required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon, and excepting the intersections of "C" street with 7th, 8th, and 9th streets) be paved with asphalt pavement on an asphalt concrete base, according to the drawings andneross-sections therefor hereinafter more particularly identified and according to the specifications and explanatory notes therefor accompanying said drawings and cross-sections and according to the specifications contained in Ordinance No. 1129 of the ordinances of said city, entitled, "An Ordinance Prescribing Specifications for "Asphalt Pavement on Asphalt Concrete Base in the City of San Diego, California", adopted May 19th 1902, and in Ordinance No. 2187 of the ordinances of said city, adopted October 16th, 1905, and entitled, "An Ordinance Amending Section 2 and Section 7 of Ordinance No. 1129 of the Ordinances of the City of San Diego, Approved on the 3rd Day of June, 1902, and Repealing Ordinance No. 1147, Approved on the 17th Day of June, 1902."

J.T.Butler, City Clerk. By Percy L. Day, Deputy. Communication from City Engineer Plans, Drawings and Cross-sections for Paving "C" street from 6th to 12th streets", and copies of the same are on file in the office of the engineer of said city, and all the drawings, cross-sections and typical drawings, with the specifications and explanatory notes accompanying the same and contained in said Document No. 16699, are hereby approved and adopted as the drawings, cross-sections and specifications to be followed in connection with the other specifications herein referred to in the construction of said culverts and their appertaining structures as shown thereby and in the paving of said "C" street and said intersections of streets therewith, and by reference thereto all said drawings, cross-sections, typical drawings and specifications and explanatory notes accompanying the same, contained in said Document No. 16699, and said Ordinances Nos.1129 and 2187 are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

At a point on the West line of University Boulevard 350 feet North of the North line of Blaine Avenue the grade elevation to remain 309.00 feet.

At a point on the East line of University Boulevard 350 feet north of the north line of Blaine Avenue, the grade elevation to remain 309.00 feet.

At the South-west corner of the intersection of University Boulevard with Lincoln Avenue, change the grade elevation from 314.00 feet to 312.00 feet; at the North-west corner thereof, change the grade elevation from 315.60 feet to 315.00 feet; at the South-east corner thereof, change the grade elevation from 314.00 feet to 313.00 feet; and at the North-east corner thereof, the grade elevation to remain at 315.60 feet.

At a point on the west line of University Boulevard, 200 feet South of the South line of Campus Avenue, the grade elevation to remain at 334.80 feet.

At a point on the East line of University Boulevard, 100 feet North of the .40
North line of Lincoln Avenue, change the grade elevation from 320 feet to 322.00 feet; at

a point on the East line of University Boulevard, 200 feet north of the last named point, change the grade elevation from 330.00 feet to 334.00 feet; and at a point on the east line of University Boulevard, 200 feet North of the last named point, change the grade elevation from 339.60 feet to 342.00 feet.

At the intersection of the Northwest line of Centre street with the southwest line of Blaine avenue, change the grade elevation from 305.50 feet to 303.50 feet; at the intersection of the Northwest line of Centre street with the northeast line of Blaine Avenue, change the grade elevation from 306.00 feet to 304.00 feet; at the intersection of the southeast line of Centre street with the southwest line of Blaine avenue, change the grade elevation 305.50 feet to 303.50 feet; and at the intersection of the southeast line of Centre street with the northeast line of Blaine Avenue, change the grade elevation from 306.00 feet to 304.00 feet.

TO CHANGE THE GRADE OF KEARNEY AVENUE BETWEEN ITS INTERSECTION

WITH N AND 18TH STREETS AND A POINT DISTANT 50

FEET SOUTHEAST OF THE SOUTHEAST

LINE OF SIGSBEE, AND THE GRADE

OF STREETS INTERSECTING

THEREWITH BETWEEN SAID POINTS.

WHEREAS, the owners of a majority of the property affected by the herein proposed change of grade of Kearney Avenue between its intersection with N and 18th street, and a point 50 feet Southeast of the Southeast line of Sigsbee Street, and the grade of streets intersecting therewith between said points, as hereinafter more particularly specified, all in the City of San Diego, have petitioned the Common Council of the said City of San Diego to change the grades thereof, and

WHEREAS, the said Common Council of said City hereby finds that said petition contains the names of the owners of a majority of the property to be affected by the said proposed changes of grades of said streets, and that it is for the public benefit to make said changes of grades and to establish the grade of said Kearney Avenue and said intersecting streets as hereinafter set forth, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that it is the intention of the Common Council of said City of San Diego to change and establish the grade of said Kearney Avenue and said intersecting streets as follows, to-wit:

At the intersection of the south line of "N" Street with the northeasterly line of Kearney Avenue, the grade elevation to remain at 24.84 feet; at the intersection of the east line of Eighteenth street with the southwesterly line of Kearney Avenue, the grade elevation to remain at 22.60 feet; at the west corner of the intersection of Kearney Avenue with Sigsbee Street, change the grade elevation from 21.00 feet to 21.60 feet; at the the north corner thereof, change the grade elevation from 21.00 feet to 23.25 feet; at the south corner thereof, change the grade elevation from 22.00 feet to 23.00 feet; at the east corner thereof, change the grade elevation from 22.00 feet to 23.60 feet.

At a point on the northeast line of Kearney Avenue, 20 feet southeasterly from the east corner of the intersection of Kearney Avenue with Sigshee Street, change the grade elevation from 23.20 feet to 23.90 feet; and at a point on the north-easterly line of Kearney Avenue, 30 feet southeasterly from the last named point, the grade elevation to remain at 25.00 feet.

OF PAVING "C" STREET FROM THE EAST LINE OF SIXTH STREET TO THE WEST
LINE OF TWELFTH STREET, AND CONSTRUCTING CULVERTS AND CONCRETE CURBS THEREON AND UPON STREETS INTERSECTING
THEREWITH, ALL BETWEEN THE POINTS HEREIN

BEFORE MENTIONED.

RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of San Diego, a municipal corporation in the County of San Diego, State of California, that the public interest and convenience of said city require that the street work hereinafter described be done, and therefore the said common council hereby orders the following street work to be done in said city, to wit:

That the roadway of "C" street from the east line of Sixth street to the west line of Twelfth street, in the City of San Diego, California, including the entire width of said roadway from curb line to curb line, and including the intersections of "C" street with all streets intersecting therewith between the east line of Sixth street and the west line of Twelfth street, from curb line to curb line of said intersections, (excepting such portions of said "C" street and the said intersections of streets therewith, between said points, required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon, and excepting the intersections of "C" street with 7th, 8th and 9th streets) be paved with asphalt pavement on an asphalt concrete base, according to the drawings and cross-sections therefor hereinafter more particularly identified and according to the specifications and explanatory notes therefor accompanying said drawings and cross-sections and according to the specifications contained in Ordinance No. 1129 of the ordinances of said city, entitled, "An Ordinance Prescribing Specifications for Asphalt Pavement on Asphalt Concrete Base in the City of San Diego, California", adopted May 19th, 1902, and in Ordinance No. 2187 of the ordinances of said city, adopted October 16th, 1905, and entitled, "An Ordinance Amending Section 2 and Section 7 of Ordinance No. 1129 of the Ordinances of the City of San Diego, Approved on the 3rd day of June, 1902, and Repealing Ordinance No. 1147, Approved on the 17th day of June, 1902."

Provided, however, that as to those parts of said "C" street and said intersections of streets therewith to be occupied by the culverts hereinafter provided for, the concrete base of said pavement shall terminate where it joins said culverts as shown by the drawings for said culverts, which drawings are hereinafter more particularly identified (said base being identified upon said drawings by the words "asphaltic concrete"), and the asphalt surface of said pavement shall be continued over said culverts and beyond the curb lines of said "C" street, and of said intersections of streets therewith, to the extent as shown by, and in the manner and all in accordance with, the said drawings for said culverts (said asphalt surface being identified on said drawings, viz, "Asphaltum 2").

Also, that there be constructed on said "C" street between said east line of Sixth street and said west line of Twelfth street, and upon the intersections of streets with "C" street and streets intersecting "C" street between Sixth street and Twelfth street, all the culverts with their appurtenances shown by the drawings for culverts hereinafter more particularly identified; that each of said culverts, with its appurtenances, be located at the place where it is by said drawings shown to be located and, together with its appurtenances, be constructed of the materials and of the size and dimensions and in all respects according to, and in the manner required by, said drawings, including the typical drawings for culverts hereinaftermore particularly identified, and in accordance with the general specifications and explanatory notes for culverts and their appurtenances accompanying said drawings, and in accordance with the ordinances referred to in the general specifications accompanying said drawings, to wit: the ordinances Nos. 1129 and 2187 hereinbefore more particularly identified, as said ordinances are modified by said specifications accompanying said drawings (excepting that such portions of said culverts, or of, their appurtenances, located in that portion of said "C" street or said streets intersecting "C"

street or intersections of streets required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon, shall not be constructed by authority of this resolution or included as a part of the work to be done hereunder).

The aforesaid drawings and cross-sections, with the specifications and explanatory notes accompanying the same, for said paving and aforesaid drawings and typical drawings, with the general specifications and explanatory notes accompanying the same, for said culverts and their appurtenances, are contained in that certain document on file in the office of the clerk of said city and endorsed as follows, to wit: "Document No. 16699 Mar 15-1907. J.T.Butler, City Clerk. By Percy L. Day, Deputy. Communication from City Engineer Plans, Drawings and Cross-sections for Paving "C" Street from 6th to 12th Streets", and copies of the same are on file in the office of the engineer of said city, and all the drawings, cross-sections and typical drawings, with the specifications and explanatory notes accompanying the same and contained in said Document No. 16699, are hereby approved and adopted as the drawings, cross-sections and specifications to be followed in connection with the other specifications herein referred to in the construction of said culverts and their appertaining structures as shown thereby and in the paving of said "C" street and said intersections of streets therewith, and by reference thereto all said drawings, crosssections, typical drawings and specifications and explanatory notes accompanying the same, contained in said Document No. 16699, and said Ordinance's Nos. 1129 and 2187 are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

And said work shall include grading and preparing the roadbed, trenching for culverts, and all other things required by said Ordinances Nos. 1129 and 2187 and shown by the contents of said Document No. 16699 to be necessary for the construction of said culverts and their appurtenances and the laying of said pavement in accordance therewith.
