

Clean Green Material



Clean Green Material includes:
leaves, grass clippings, shrubbery, brush, tree trunks, limbs, and branches not exceeding ten feet in length or six inches in diameter.

No BAGS (plastic or paper), dirt and rocks, glass or metal, demolition debris and trash of any kind.

A load **must** be 90% Clean Green Material. It may contain 10% non-green material with anything over 10% removed by the customer.

Clean Green Material excludes the following plants:

For every 90% of clean wood scrap there may be up to 10% non-clean wood</p>
