## "DARE TO REUSE" WILL SHOWCASE TALENT BY LOCAL STUDENTS The New Children's Museum will exhibit artwork beginning Saturday at 10 a.m.

Compact disks, buttons, barks and leaves, plastic bits and pieces, imagine the possibilities for items considered no longer useful. City of San Diego students showcase the endless potential of function for items usually destined for the trash in "Dare to Reuse", an exhibition of artwork made from found objects.

Councilmember Todd Gloria will be on hand to kick off the exhibit being held at the New Children's Museum from November 16, 2012 through January 31, 2013, sponsored by the City of San Diego's Environmental Services Department, WAXIE Sanitary Supply, Inc., and the New Children's Museum.

The top twelve winners are chosen to be in an on-line calendar on the ESD website, and this year is the first that the pieces will be on exhibit at a one-of-a-kind museum that provides inventive and engaging art experiences that are meaningful to children and families.
