



2013 Certified Roofing Material Recycling Facility Directory



On July 1, 2008, the Construction and Demolition (C&D) Debris Deposit Ordinance took effect. It requires that the majority of construction, demolition and remodeling projects requiring building, combination and demolition permits submit a completed Waste Management Form, pay a refundable C&D Debris Recycling Deposit and divert at least 50% of their C&D debris through: recycling at Certified Recycling Facilities (see below), on-site or off-site reuse of the C&D debris, or other donation of the C&D debris acceptable to the Environmental Services Director (Director). Save all recycling, reuse and disposal receipts from project related debris for requesting a refund. In certain cases as proof of evidence of reuse of the project debris, photos documenting the donation and reuse of materials may be accepted, subject to the Director’s approval. Photos must be accompanied by written volume estimates. **A project address must be included on all receipts.**

***Certified Mixed C&D Transfer Stations:** At all transfer stations, drivers must specify that the loads are for recycling. To qualify for a deposit refund, loads must be accepted and documented as mixed C&D debris to be transferred to a Certified Mixed C&D Processing Facility. (The diversion rate for these facilities is based on the destination facility to which the material is transferred.)
