

### **City of San Diego Hosts 35<sup>th</sup> Annual Christmas Tree Recycling Program**

*Recycling Christmas Trees Extends the Life of the Miramar Landfill  
and Provides Free Mulch and Compost for City Residents*

**SAN DIEGO, CA**—The City of San Diego Environmental Services Department will host the **35<sup>th</sup> Annual Christmas Tree Recycling Program** beginning December 26, 2008 and running through January 23, 2009. This year's program will offer 16 drop-off locations, available to City residents only, as well as curbside pickup for those customers with curbside yard waste collection.



“Recycling Christmas trees is an important way for San Diegans to help the environment and extend the life of the Miramar Landfill,” said Chris Gonaver, director of the Environmental Services Department. “Historically, yard clippings and other organic materials, such as Christmas trees, have made up over 20 percent of the material buried in the landfill. By recycling their trees, residents help reduce the amount of material in the landfill and give holiday trees a second life as compost, mulch or wood chips.”

Before December 26, San Diegans can recycle Christmas trees seven days-a-week at the Miramar Greenery located at the Miramar Landfill.

Beginning December 26, 2008 and continuing through January 23, 2009, residents can drop off clean trees during daylight hours at any of the 16 drop-off locations listed below.

Trees from commercial tree lots or fundraising projects will not be accepted at the drop-off locations. Instead, these trees can be dropped off free of charge at the Miramar Greenery.

Residents participating in the Christmas Tree Recycling Program should drop off trees during daylight hours. Before depositing trees, all tree stands, lights, ornaments and other tree decorations must be removed. Please do not illegally dump any other items at the drop-off locations.

In addition to clean trees, flocked trees (fake snow) are also accepted. All trees will be recycled into high quality mulch and compost, which is available throughout the year to city residents for free if self-loaded at the Miramar Greenery.

Residents who currently receive curbside yard waste recycling collection can also recycle trees through the curbside collection program by placing trees at the curb with the regular yard waste recycling. Residents who wish to recycle trees through the curbside recycling program are required to remove all non-recyclable materials such as tinsel, ornaments and lights before placing trees at the curb next to yard waste collection containers.

7. Mission Bay:	SeaWorld Drive at Pacific Highway.

8. Oak Park:	Chollas Lake, 6350 College Grove Drive, in Gloria's Mesa parking lot.
9. Ocean Beach:	Robb Athletic Field Recreation Center, 2525 Bacon Street.
10. Otay Mesa/Nestor:	Montgomery Waller Community Park (upper and lower-west parking lots).
11. Rancho Bernardo:	Rancho Bernardo Recreation Center, 18448 W. Bernardo Drive.
12. Rancho Peñasquitos:	Canyonside Recreation Center, 12350 Black Mountain Road.
13. San Diego State University:	Parking Lot D off Alvarado Road.
14. Scripps Ranch:	Scripps Ranch Recreation Center, 11454 Blue Cypress Drive.
15. Tierrasanta:	De Portola Middle School, 11010 Clairemont Mesa Boulevard.
16. University City:	Swanson Pool, 3585 Governor Drive.

The Miramar Greenery is located inside the Miramar Landfill, at 5180 Convoy Street, just north of Highway 52. Hours of operation are Monday through Friday 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; Saturdays, Sundays and most holidays from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The Landfill will be closed on Christmas Day and New Year's Day.
