16	THE PARTIES STIPULATE AS FOLLOWS:	
17	1. Petitioner Alison Adema is the	General Counsel of the City of San Diego
18	Ethics Commission [Ethics Commission]. The Ethics Commission is charged with a duty to	
19	administer, implement, and enforce local governmental ethics laws contained in the San Diego	
20	Municipal Code [SDMC] relating to, among other things, the provisions of the City's Municipal	
21	Lobbying Ordinance.	
22	2. At all material times mentioned	herein, Respondent Public Solutions [Respondent]
23	was a lobbying firm registered with the Office of the City Clerk. Mitchell Berner, the firm's	
24	principal, has been a registered lobbyist in the City since 2001.	
25	3. This Stipulation, Decision and	Order [Stipulation] will be submitted for
26	consideration by the Ethics Commission at its next scheduled meeting, and the agreements	
27	contained herein are contingent upon the approval of the Stipulation and the accompanying	
28	Decision and Order by the Ethics Commission	on.

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months late. Respondent's disclosure report for the second quarter of 2009 was due on July 31,

2009, but Respondent did not file it until November 5, 2009, approximately three months late.

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1	Factors in Aggravation	
2	17. Respondent is an experienced lobbying firm in the City of San Diego and was	
3	aware of the quarterly filing requirements in the Lobbying Ordinance. Moreover, the City Clerk	
4	staff sent numerous reminder letters to Respondent concerning its quarterly filing obligations.	
5	18. Respondent failed to cooperate with the Commission's investigation. In	
6	particular, Respondent failed to respond to telephone calls and letters from the Commission staff	
7	from April through July of 2009. On August 19, 2009, Respondent was served with notice that a	
8	Probable Cause Hearing would be conducted in this case on November 6, 2009, regarding	
9	alleged violations of the Lobbying Ordinance. On November 4, 2009, two days before the	
10	Probable Cause Hearing, Respondent sent the Commission staff the late quarterly disclosure	
11	reports described above in paragraph 16. (Commission staff filed the reports with the City Clerk	
12	on November 5, 2009, on Respondent's behalf).	
13	<u>Conclusion</u>	
14	19. Respondent agrees to take necessary and prudent precautions to comply with all	
15	provisions of the City's Municipal Lobbying Ordinance in the future.	
16	20. Respondent agrees to pay a fine in the amount of \$4,500. This amount must be	
17	paid to the City Treasurer no later than June 30, 2010, by check, money order, or credit card.	
18	Respondent acknowledges that if the fine is not timely paid in full, the Commission may refer	
19	the collection of the fine to the City Treasurer's Collection Division, which may pursue any or	
20	all available legal remedies to recover late penalties, interest, and costs, in addition to seeking the	
21	outstanding balance owed.
