- a. Linda Vista Community Update- Commissioner Pepe Cervantes and Evelyn Ramirez
  - i. Linda Vista Cup Soccer Tournament on 11/15/08 to promote healthy living and gang prevention and serving as a kickoff for a soccer club in the area
  - ii. Parks and Recreation summer free swimming pool was provided as something for the children of the community to enjoy.

Family Success Center and Youth Action Team consist of USD students and professor conducting survey to see what resources the center can provide and any potential problems that prevent the community from using the center. Finding ways to be more accessible and convenient for the parents and children of Montgomery middle school.
- vii. New Emerging Gang in Linda Vista called "FK-Fucking Klowns" consists of white, black, and Mexican youth. Sgt. Contreras has a parent awareness curriculum that wants to instill in community as well.
- viii. Juvenile Probationers as of July 2008; in District 6 a total of 206 where Linda
  Vista has 77- 48 being the majority consists of Mexican/ Hispanic youth aged 13-17, 17 are white mostly 16-18, 9 black aged 13-17, and 3 Asian and other 16-17.
