The primary goals of the CRN are to:

- provide a well developed care management component and delivery of services
- increase communication and coordination among agencies to better operate during, but not limited to, times of crisis
- de-escalate retaliation after a homicide or violent incident
- support families and community through healing



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- The CRN is operating/emerging in three main neighborhoods:
 - **Mission/Excelsior**
 - **Western Addition**
 - **Bayview Hunter's Point/Potrero Hill**
 - **Visitation Valley**
 - **API (City Wide)**

- Language Capacity: Cantonese, Mandarin, Toishanese, Vietnamese, Cambodian, Tagalog, Samoan



School Distribution



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
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

Prevention Outreach

- School presentations
- CBO workshops
- Support group activities
- After school outreach
- Early evening outreach
- Field trips



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Intervention Outreach

- Defuse conflicts
- Identify and outreach to “hot spots”/canvass neighborhood/give rides
- Refer youth into care management component or other services
- Juvenile Hall support groups
- Build rapport with groups/individuals



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Case Management....

- Provide intensive support to youth 14-24 years old, and their families.
- Referrals come from CRN outreach, victim services, adult probation, juvenile probation and crisis response teams.

We work with youth and families to:

- Set goals toward their future
- Develop plans for reaching these goals
- Link them to needed services
- Provide support for follow-through
- Provide court advocacy
- Be available at times of crisis and doubt
- Help in celebrating their successes



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- Based on the overall risk level of the cases, the following serves as a guideline of how often to meet with a client:

Risk Level:

- **Thriving/Safe = Once a month for monitoring purposes**
- **Sufficient/Stable = Twice a month**
- **At Risk = Once a week**
- **In Crisis = Up to several times a week depending on crisis**



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CRISIS RESPONSE - IMMEDIATE RESPONSE

- Will be notified by DPH/Crisis Response Team of the following violent incidents: homicide/critical wounding (immediately via telephone); non-fatal shooting (within 24 hours via telephone or email)
- If applicable (and when staffing allows), CRN will support the crime scene by working with the community/residents gathered (NOT CROWD CONTROL) to diffuse situations, communicate with SFPD, and provide answers (if applicable) to the community
- Upon first of arrival of both CRN and CRT staffs, the two will convene to coordinate a strategy for addressing family and community needs

CRISIS RESPONSE - FIRST 30 DAYS

- DE-ESCALATION through strategic outreach efforts and follow up of individual care managed clients
- Coordinate with SFPD & SFUSD
- Communicate and coordinate with CRT
- General support for the family
- Presence at wake or funerals
- Coordinate community healing activities (i.e., candle light vigils, healing circles, setting up shrines)



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COMMUNITY RESPONSE NETWORK ASIAN PACIFIC ISLANDER (CRNAPI) INITIATIVE

CRISIS RESPONSE - POST 30 DAYS

- Provide long term follow up (90 day, 150 day)
- Reconnect family with DPH/other mental health services as needs emerge
- Target STREET OUTREACH strategies
- Attempt to link youth into CARE MANAGEMENT or other appropriate services
- Keep track of important community (death) anniversaries to coordinate healing activities



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
