PRESENTATIONS AND ACTION ITEMS

GANG INVOLVEMENT IN HUMAN TRAFFICKING – A PIMPS’ PERSPECTIVE

Jarasion Bowser (Paving Great Futures) underscored the importance of putting a face on pimping as well as the victims of sex trafficking in relation to gang involvement.

PROSTITUTION IMPACT PANEL

Deputy City Attorney Jamie Ledesma provided an overview of the Impact Panel and its work to manage the grey area of the laws that impact prostitution.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING and GANG INVOLVEMENT

Dr. Jamie Gates (Point Loma University) gave an overview of the research he and Dr. Ami Carpenter are doing. Dr. Gates also provided an update on the San Diego County Regional Human Trafficking and SCEC Advisory Council Report.

Actions to be taken by the Commissions -

1. Letter to the Mayor and Chief Operating Officer recommending education for City Staff on the signs of youth and adults being trafficked (specifically for Park and Recreation and Library staff).
2. Letter to the Board of Supervisors, Mayor, and City Council urging implementation of recommendations in the Human Trafficking and CSEC Advisory Council Report.
3. Letter to the Sheriff and to the Chief of Police urging their support of rehabilitation resources for pimps and not just punitive actions.
4. Letter to the Chief of Police recommending line up training for All SDPD Patrol Officers on the signs of youth and adults being trafficked.
5. Letter to Mayor and Chief of Police requesting a report on the suppression activities related to gangs and human trafficking to specifically address targeted sweeps and any biased focuses that might occur.

Motion was made by Commissioner Dana Brown (CGPI) to recommend the above actions. Seconded by Commissioner Gary Lynn (CGPI)

A friendly amendment was made by Commissioners Dana Brown (CGPI) to add to the above mentioned actions "trauma informed care and resiliency"

Motion to approve the motion as amendmended was seconded by Commissioner Joyce Abrams (CGPI) and by Commissioner Lorena Slomansen (HRC).

RESTORATIVE JUSTICE

Restorative Justice from Youth Perspective Youth from Mid-City with Commissioner Dana Brown (CGPI).

The Teralta Park family (*Arturo Soriano, Alma Hernandez, Tony Hernandez, Salvador Robles, and Mrs. Soriano*) shared about their work and their experienced. They presented the Commissions with some questions.

Southeastern Justice Court – Presented by Officer Linda Tousley
Officer Tousley discussed the work being done out of the Southeastern Division providing services to at-risk youth.

Recommended Actions:

1. Letter to the Mayor and City Council expressing support for initiatives currently in place and urging support for new initiatives in this area.
2. Letter to the Mayor and Chief of Police Requesting that other SDPD Divisions be encouraged to establish similar restorative justice courts.
3. The two commissions work collaboratively to host a summit regarding wrap around services with a focus on families to promote restorative justice principles.
