Course Description: This 80-hour introductory course includes lecture and skills training for those aspiring to be lifeguards for oceanfront and inland beaches. Subject matter ranges from the history of lifeguarding and the responsibilities of the individual lifeguard to the hands-on skills required to rescue and assist the public. Course content follows the standards of the United States Lifesaving Association.

The San Diego Regional Lifeguard Academy involves rigorous physical training. The training includes events that must be completed in a specified time including a 500 meter swim in ten (10) minutes or less, a one (1) mile run in eight (8) minutes or less, and a timed run-swim-run.
