501. Blue World Shamu Expansion and 2015 Sundry Project Review – Jerry Howes SeaWorld

Mr. Howes, SeaWorld, spoke about the Blue World expansion which will remove the existing habitat and create a new aquatic habitat three-hundred fifty (350) feet across and

fifty (50) feet deep. The habitat and surrounding improvements will <u>not</u> have any structures taller than thirty (30) feet. The project will submit an application for permit to the California Coastal Commission later this year.

Public Comment:

Nine (9) members of the public attended who were in support of the project but didn't speak.

Six (6) were against the project citing:

- Contamination produced by SeaWorld which pollutes the water
- Orca's die in captivity
- Negative environment impacts
- Terrible condition for animals

Mr. Howes spoke on the SeaWorld San Diego 2015 capital improvements which include the following categories:

- Maintenance or Replacement Projects
- Minor Construction Projects
- Capital Equipment Purchase
- Construction Projects

502. Customer Advocate Presentation, Public Utilities Department – David Akin

Mr. Atkins is the public advocate for the Public Utilities Department. He gave an overview of the Customer Advocate's Role:

- Focus on entire customer service
- Help navigate complex procedures/organizations
- Cross functional go-to person
- Engage, facilitate and expedite resolution of customer services issues

Mr. Atkins explained the water portion of utility bills, reasons for high bills, meter reading and errors. Mr. Atkins talked about the residential water survey and how a City representative can visit your home and:

- Show you how to read your meter
- Check for leaks
- Measure your water fixtures Provide low-flow shower heads, faucets and aerators if needed.
- Review irrigation systems
- Make irrigation schedule suggestions
