INFORMATION ITEMS

501. Aquaculture Farm – Don Kent, CEO of Hubbs SeaWorld Research Institution

Mr. Kent spoke about the Rose Canyon Fisheries (RCF) Sustainable Aquaculture Project. It is a way to feed future generations in harmony with the ocean and is dedicated to fulfilling a major void in the seafood industry by demonstrating a new paradigm for seafood production.

RCF will serve as a model for the development of sustainable open-ocean aquaculture in California and the United States. It will create new jobs, sustain existing jobs and help to ensure that the existing infrastructure for seafood processing and distribution has a viable future. The consumer will benefit from a year-round supply of high-quality seafood that is safe and healthy. By 2022 RCF will generate more than \$50 million in total economic impact annually. At peak employment, RCF will employ seventy-two (72) people directly and support more than 300 total jobs in the region every year through indirect and induced impacts. \$93.2 million in new state and local taxes will be generated over the first ten (10) years of operation. RCF will eventually produce \$11 million pounds of fish annually to meet growing demand.

91 % of seafood consumed in the United States is imported. Seafood imports \$14 billion annually. Seafood is the largest food item contributing to the trade deficit. 50% of all seafood consumed in the world is farmed.

The project has had regulatory review by; National Environmental Production Act Certification Army Corp of Engineers, Environmental Protection Agency, California Coastal Commission, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and United States Coast Guard.

The Mission Bay Park Committee would like to put the concept on a future agenda as an Action Item in order to show support to the project.
