THE SAN DIEGUITO RIVER VALLEY CONSERVANCY

Is a non-profit environmental conservancy dedicated to sustainable management of the natural resources of the San Dieguito Watershed with priority given to the protection of the river corridor

Has a 20-year record of moving the vision of a 55-mile San Dieguito River Park and Coast-to-Crest Trail – from the ocean at Del Mar to Volcan Mountain north of Julian – to a maturing reality

Acquires land to complete the River Park, extends the segments of the Coast-to-Crest Trail that are open, and assists with careful management of River Park lands

Is led by a citizen Board of Directors and is supported in our activities and financially by more than 1,000 Conservancy members

Partners with the River Park, citizens, land owners, governments and other non-governmental groups to ensure coordinated protection of the river corridor resources while fully respecting and protecting private property rights

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Conservancy has a record of accomplishment. It has participated in the acquisition of 2,900 acres of land which have been added to the San Dieguito River Park. The Conservancy is continuing its work to purchase key land acquisitions and to fill in gaps in the Coast-to-Crest Trail, as well as control invasive

plants, restore wetlands and other key habitats, and educate the public about the values of nature and the ways they can contribute to the legacy of the San Dieguito River Park.

CONSERVANCY PROGRAMS & RESULTS

The San Dieguito River Valley Conservancy has four types of programs: <u>Land Acquisition</u>, <u>Trail</u> <u>Acceleration</u>, <u>Habitat Management</u>, and <u>Environmental Education</u>. Summary of Conservancy Programs and Results

Nearly 80% of the 80,000 acres within the planning area for the 55-mile San Dieguito River Park is in protected public ownership.

The Conservancy has been involved in the acquisition of 19 parcels of land, totaling about 8,300 acres.

Conservancy-led volunteer program has restored the natural habitat of Crest Canyon, which runs south from the San Dieguito Lagoon between I-5 and Jimmy Durante Drive, and another habitat restoration project is underway.

Donations to the Conservancy are funding the development of 12 miles of trail between Boden Canyon and Lake Sutherland and a trail connection between the San Pasqual Valley and the Poway Trails System.

35 miles of the Coast-to-Crest Trail and 20 miles of side trail are open for public use.

The Conservancy conducts general public and "Members Only" hikes to educate about the environmental values of the river corridor and provides an "Outdoor Learning Laboratory" experiences for school groups.

VISION & VALUES

The Conservancy's vision is to maintain the natural integrity, and where necessary to restore the natural functioning, of one of San Diego County's only remaining, largely undeveloped river corridors. We are accomplishing this vision by assisting to secure the San Dieguito River Park and by creating the Coast-to-Crest Trail which extends 55-miles from the beach at Del Mar to Volcan Mountain, north of Julian.

Habitat Restoration

We host monthly habitat restoration work events in the San Dieguito Lagoon and the surrounding upland areas in the western end of the River Park. CONSERVANCY FINANCES

The Conservancy's ongoing programs to purchase land, extend trails, maintain and restore habitat and provide environmental education are supported by annual membership donations. The Conservancy leverages local membership support by matching state and foundation grants.

The Conservancy works in active partnership with other organizations both governmental and nongovernmental. For example, Bernardo Mountain was purchased jointly with the River Park Joint Powers Authority with the assistance of the City of Escondido, San Diego County, the Friends of the San Dieguito

River Valley, The Nature Conservancy and the Trust for Public Land.

Overview

The San Dieguito River Valley Conservancy is a 501(c)(3) non-profit Corporation

- Donations to the Conservancy are tax-deductible under Federal and State laws and IRS regulations

- The Conservancy follows standard accounting procedures; its financial reports are on public record and available for members to review

Fundraising Philosophy & Targets

Board policy is to cover the great majority of operating costs from membership contributions

Supporters have the option to provide general support or earmark donations for particular programs or properties

Donations are leveraged to draw in State grant funds for land acquisition and habitat restoration

Strict privacy policy respects requests for anonymity with no sharing of donor information

First priority is securing the River Park through the leveraged acquisition of strategic properties
