SUBJECT:

Dana Middle School Joint-Use Agreement Amendment

SUMMARY

<u>Issue</u> – Should the San Diego Park and Recreation Board approve an amendment to the joint-use agreement for Dana Middle School to remove a 3 acre baseball field from the joint use area?

<u>Director's Recommendation</u> – Do not approve an amendment to the joint-use agreement for Dana Middle School.

Other Recommendations

Upon hearing the item a second time at their June 11, 2013 meeting, the Ocean Beach Recreation Council voted unanimously to approve the amendment to the Dana Middle School joint-use agreement to remove the baseball field from the joint-use area with recommendations. The recommendations from the Ocean Beach Recreation Council are addressed in the Discussion section of this report below.

<u>Fiscal Impact</u> – Should the proposed amendment be approved, the currently budgeted 0.20 Grounds Maintenance Worker position and the non-personnel expenses associated with the baseball field will be distributed to other Park and Recreation facilities within the Peninsula community.

Water and Energy Conservation Status – Not applicable.

<u>Environmental</u> – This activity will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment, and is therefore not subject to CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15060(c) (2).

BACKGROUND

On May 16, 2013 the Park and Recreation Board (Board) considered the proposal from the San Diego Unified School District (SDUSD) to remove the 3 acre baseball field from the joint-use area at Dana Middle School located in the Peninsula community of San Diego. The Board voted unanimously to table the item and have SDUSD provide additional information to the Board. The additional information requested was:

- 1. Explore additional joint-use areas within the Peninsula community which could be swapped for the Dana Middle School baseball field,
- 2. Evaluate SDUSD's fee schedule for renting the baseball field to determine if the fee charged could be aligned with the current fees charged by the City,
- 3. Provide additional information regarding the Ad Hoc Committee identified in the November 16, 2012 letter from SDUSD to Ms. Stacey LoMedico,
- 4. Return to the Ocean Beach Recreation Council with additional information,
- 5. Request a formal proposal from the potential donor, Mr. David Wells.

Attached to this report is a response to these requests from Ms. Debora Beaver of SDUSD addressed to Ms. Stacey LoMedico, dated July 9, 2013. The Park and Recreation Department in conjunction with the Park Planning Section of the Development Services Department (DSD) have not had an opportunity to fully evaluate the potential of joint use at the school sites identified in SDUSD's response, but do agree these could be viable joint-use sites for consideration.

DISCUSSION

The Ocean Beach Recreation Council is the sanctioned Park and Recreation Department advisory body which oversees the permitted use of the athletic fields at Dana Middle School joint-use area. This proposal was presented to them at their regularly scheduled meeting on February 12, 2013. The Ocean Beach Recreation Council voted 1-0 with 4 abstentions not to support the removal of the baseball field from the joint-use area due to the lack of sufficient information. The proposal was presented to the Ocean Beach Recreation Council a second time at their regularly scheduled meeting on June 11, 2013 by the Point Loma Baseball Boosters, the Point Loma High School baseball coach and the San Diego Adult Baseball League. The Ocean Beach Recreation Council voted unanimously to support the transfer of the Dana Middle School baseball field to SDUSD under the following conditions: (Note: the following conditions listed were taken from an e-mail from Mr. Byron Wear because the Ocean Beach Recreation Council minutes will not be approved until their August meeting. Representatives of the administrative staff from SDUSD or Park and Recreation Department did not attend as they were not aware the item was being presented at the meeting.)

- 1. That SDUSD obtain a Letter of Commitment from the donor and that if not, SDUSD commit to the renovation of the field by a private donor and if not, by capital funding from the Proposition Z bond or other school district funds.
- 2. That SDUSD or a donor commit to maintain the field at a higher level than the Park and Recreation Department for competitive baseball play at the high school level.
- 3. That the existing adult baseball sports groups be allowed continued use of the Dana lower field at reasonable fees charged at other schools.

- 4. That SDUSD keep a gate open for use of the Point Loma High School track and football field for general recreation when not in use by school sports during non school hours, on weekends and summer.
- 5. Park and Recreation Department pursue additional joint-use agreements with other schools in the Peninsula area (in the future).

Due to the current population-based park deficit, current land constraints and the cost of land acquisition within the Peninsula Community, the City's Development Services Department / Park Planning Section and Park and Recreation Department staff recommend the removal of the baseball field from the Dana Middle School joint-use area not be supported. Council District 2 does support amending the joint-use agreement to remove the baseball field from the joint-use area.

The recommendation of the Park and Recreation Board will be carried forward to the full City Council for their consideration. The item will be brought forward to City Council after the summer recess.

ALTERNATIVES

- 1. Approve the proposed amendment to the joint-use agreement for Dana Middle School to remove the baseball field from the joint-use area with additional amendments to the agreement.
- 2. Do not approve the proposed amendment to the joint-use agreement for Dana Middle School.

SUBJECT: Dana Middle School Joint Use Agreement

On May 16, 2013, the Park and Recreation Board (Board) heard the district's request to remove the baseball field from the Dana Middle School (Dana) joint use agreement. The Board tabled the item asking the district and City to consider five points and bring the item back to the Board via the Ocean Beach Recreation Council.

Point 1: Potential Joint Use sites in Point Loma

The district has five schools in the Point Loma area that do not currently have joint use and could be potential joint use sites, if they meet the joint use criteria.

- Correia Middle School
- Dewey Elementary School
- Loma Portal Elementary School
- Silver Gate Elementary School
- Sunset View Elementary School

Point 2: Ad Hoc Committee on Field Usage

The purpose of the Ad Hoc Committee will be to review the Education Codes and the district's current policies and procedures for opening the fields to the public. The district board members understand the schools are public resources and believe the public should have access to the recreational areas of the school during non-school hours.

Point 3: San Diego Unified Civic Center Fees

The Board of Education approves the Civic Center Rate Schedule annually. The latest Rate Schedule is attached. District staff work with the various user groups to make sure they receive the best possible rates and will continue this practice should the district permit the baseball field at Dana.

Point 4: Written Proposal from David Wells

The district will continue to work with Mr. Wells to finalize a written agreement. It is our understanding that Scott Barnett, San Diego Unified board member has written Mr. Faulconer a letter committing the district to renovate the field. (attached)

Point 5: Ocean Beach Recreation Council



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

UNUSUAL USE OF DISTRICT FACILITIES

Hourly rates charged for staff are subject to change

Rates for unusual use shall be determined by the Real Estate Department using this adopted schedule as a guide. Unusual use includes, but is not limited to, use of air-conditioned facilities on school days and non-school days. Organizations or groups utilizing air-conditioned facilities on school days and non-school days will be charged costs to cover the utility cost of this service. The cost is computed on the basis of the difference between SDG&E commercial rate estimates for air-conditioned and non air-conditioned spaces.

CARPETED AREAS

An additional \$7.50 fee will be added to the overall cost of any facility that is carpeted.

MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES

- A. A non-refundable \$10.00 charge is applied for each permit.
- B. A monthly \$10 processing fee will be charged for incremental payments on permits.
- C. A \$10.00 charge will be assessed for any returned checks.
- D. Hourly custodial charges will be assessed, as needed.
- E. Hourly fees for support (i.e. security, technician or house manager) will be assessed depending upon the site requirements.
- F. Special Setup: Bleacher setup charge is \$125.00 for gymnasium bleachers that must be pulled out of storage and pushed back into storage after use. Chair setup and take down is \$25.00 for each additional 50 chairs above the standard setup at the site.

RE: Transfer of Dana Lower Field (Point Loma High School) to SD Unified School District

Tonight, June 11, 2013 the Ocean Beach Park and Recreation Council voted unanimously to support the transfer of the Dana Field (Point Loma High School) to the San Diego Unified School District under conditions.

The presentation and letter of request from the Point Loma Baseball Boosters was made by Joe Radovich, Point Loma High School Baseball Coach; Scott VarArsdale and Byron Wear, PLHS Baseball Boosters; and Mike Micheli; President, San Diego Adult Baseball League. Copies of letters from SD Unified SchoolTrustee Scott Barnett, PLHS Principal Bobbie Samilson and Mike Michelli were presented and reviewed.

We hope this process can move immediately to the San Diego City Park and Recreation Board and then to the San Diego City Council for final approval at the earliest possible date in order that the work may be completed prior to the beginning of the next baseball season.

The motion was as follows:

Dear Kevin,

As the school trustee representing Point Loma I am working to improve school facilities in our community.

A year ago, we were approached by a major donor interested in making significant improvements to the Point Loma High School Baseball (lower field) located at Dana Middle School, if the field was transferred to the San Diego Unified School District. As we know, the existing field is in need of renovation and is in poor condition, particularly the outfield containing many holes where players have suffered injury.

As part of the process to transfer control to the San Diego Unified School District questions have arose as to the level of commitment to the rehabilitation of the Point Loma High baseball field at Dana. Because those negotiations are ongoing, I wanted to provide a level of assurance to the City of San Diego and the community.

As your school board representative I can assure you that the San Diego Unified School District is committed to the rehabilitation of the Dana field including leveling, new sod and installation of a synthetic area inside of the baseline. The specific details of these improvements are in negotiations with our donor and the Point Loma Baseball Boosters. Regardless of the outcome of those negotiations, these facility improvements at Dana and others will be made and are contained within the ballot language of the voter approved Proposition Z, passed by 60% of the voters in November 2012.

Additionally, under the control of the San Diego Unified School District the level of maintenance will significantly improve because we are required under law to provide a higher standard of safety for our students and athletes.

Finally, following these improvements, the field will continue to be available for public use and adult baseball leagues under the permitting process of the San Diego Unified School District under reasonable conditions required by California State Law. We are all looking forward to a great facility for our team and a wonderful community recreational asset for the Peninsula community. Thanks for your continued support.



RE: Request to transfer lower Dana field (PLHS Baseball) to San Diego Unified School District

Members of the Ocean Beach Recreation Council:

On February 12, 2013 we appeared before you in support of the transfer of the Dana lower field (Point Loma High School Baseball) from the City of San Diego to the San Diego Unified School District. At that time there were unanswered questions and there were many abstentions.

On April 18, 2013 the Peninsula Community Planning Board voted unanimously to support transfer of the Point Loma High School Baseball field at Dana School to San Diego Unified School District.

On May 16, 2013 the Park and Recreation Board tabled the item to have staff obtain additional information.

In response to concerns raised we have obtained the following letters and assurances:
