Park and Recreation Department Update of Online Registration

SUMMARY

THIS IS AN INFORMATIONAL ITEM ONLY. NO ACTION IS REQUIRED ON THE PART OF THE BOARD.

BACKGROUND

This memorandum provides an update to the online activity registration efforts by the Park and Recreation Department (Department). This provides the most recent information since the November 2013 update the Park and Recreation Board (Board) received.

Online registration is intended to improve customer service, enhance internal cash controls and reporting, and decrease staff time on routine recordkeeping tasks. Online registration was also recommended by the City Auditor in its hotline investigation report of cash handling at recreation centers in September 2012. The Department successfully implemented ActiveNet (the online software program selected for this service) by March 2013 at the following sites:

- Carmel Valley Recreation Center (program registration and point-of-sale only)
- Tierrasanta Recreation Center (program registration and point-of-sale only)
- All 13 Swimming Pools (program registration and point-of-sale for daily admissions)

To date, there are approximately 35,000 individuals in the ActiveNet database.

DISCUSSION

In January 2014, the Permit Center supporting Balboa Park, Mission Bay Park, beaches, and shoreline park locations (facility reservations) was converted to ActiveNet. On March 22, 2014 ActiveNet was expanded to the following sites: Adams, Carmel Mountain/Sabre Springs, Golden Hill, North Park, Ocean Air, Presidio, Rancho Bernardo, and Scripps Ranch Recreation Centers.

This phase also included the reservation of space at these sites and expanded this feature to Carmel Valley and Tierrasanta. This initial group of centers is considered part of Wave 1.

On February 4, 2014, a memo was distributed to all Recreation Councils regarding online expansion and charges related to ActiveNet. Since ActiveNet is a hosted solution, certain costs will be incurred by both the Department and the Recreation Councils. Currently those charges are \$2.00 per transaction and a 3% credit card fee. ActiveNet collects these charges, along with the program/permit fee, as one combined fee to the customer. The credit card fee and transaction fee are then retained by ActiveNet and the remaining amount is transmitted to the Department and Recreation Council biweekly. Programs with no fee are not assessed a transaction fee. Recreation Councils were provided with two options for these new fees: either absorb the fees or increase the cost of the class. (As an example, an existing \$50 craft class could increase to \$53.50 if the transaction and credit card fees are passed on to the participant.) Both Carmel Valley and Tierrasanta Recreation Councils have opted to include the ActiveNet fees into the rates charged to the participant. The Department suggests that all recreation councils adopt this practice to avoid funding shortfalls and provide consistency across all locations.

There should be no impact to record keeping functions for recreation councils with ActiveNet. ActiveNet has several reports that can be easily accessed. Accounting software such as QuickBooks or Quicken can continue to be used by recreation councils. However, since the City is currently upgrading computers to Windows 7, recreation councils will need to ensure accounting software media and licenses are available at sites to reinstall where needed.

Additional centers will continue to be phased in throughout 2014, with the final locations completed in June 2015 per the following tentative schedule:

- Pilot registration program implemented at Carmel Valley and Tierrasanta Recreation Centers in December 2011
- Expanded to include pools and point-of-sale in March 2013
- Facility reservations for the Permit Center completed on January 2, 2014

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Example of ActiveNet Charges for \$50 Recreation Council Craft Class

- > \$2.00 Transaction Fee
- > 3% Credit Card Fee
- Recreation Council absorbs the cost:

\$50 Paid by the Participant \$46.50 Remitted to the Recreation Council

• Recreation Council does not absorb the cost:

\$53.50 Paid by the Participant \$50.00 Remitted to the Recreation Council
