Playground Maintenance Program City Auditor Report: Performance Audit of the Park and Recreation Department's Playground Maintenance Program (July 2013)

Presentation to Park and Recreation Board November 20, 2014



In July of 2013, an independent audit was conducted on the Park and Recreation Department Playground Maintenance Program and these were the identified needs:

- 1. Enhanced oversight of the playground inspection process
- 2. Clearer performance standards related to playground inspections
- 3. A comprehensive and accurate assessment of the playground equipment



Finding 1: The Park and Recreation Department needs Enhanced Oversight of the Playground Inspection Process

- Training has been provided to supervisors and managers within the chain-of-command that have playgrounds.
- Training in the field will also be provided.



The Department will implement levels of inspections, by supervisors, designated as:

- "High-Frequency" performed weekly
- "Low-frequency" performed quarterly





- High-Frequency Inspection (HFI) forms must be completed weekly by onsite staff and signed by supervisor.
- Supervisors will be required to visit playgrounds biweekly.





High-Frequency Inspection Forms

- Focus is on routine maintenance.
- Onsite staff will document specific needs of the site.

Low-Frequency Inspections (LFI)

- Additionally, supervisors will be required to conduct a "Low-Frequency" Inspection.
- LFI entails a more comprehensive look at the playground equipment.
- LFI includes once a year a Certified Playground Safety Inspector will visit each playground and provide an evaluation of the playground.



Low-Frequency Inspection Forms

 An in-depth inspection, looking at preventative maintenance, completed quarterly.

Manager Plus software has the ability to track playgrounds as a park asset.






We will now have the ability to store and track data for all playground sites.

Finding 2: Park & Recreation Department needs clearer performance standards related to playground inspections.

Respond To Safety Hazards–Emergency:

- **Onsite Staff** Respond immediately by taking equipment out-of-use and submitting work request.
- **Citywide Park Maintenance** Repair within 14 working days of receiving work request or 14 working days after receiving replacement equipment/parts.



Finding 2 (cont.)

Respond To Non-Safety Related Issues:

- **Onsite Staff**: Respond to non-safety hazards within two days by submitting work request.
- **Citywide Park Maintenance:** Repair within 14 working days of receiving work request or 14 working days after receiving replacement equipment/parts.



Repair Categories:

"Small/Minor"

Equipment hardware that is available to Citywide staff (Examples: S hooks, chain links, clevis, shackles or other connecting fasteners)

<u>"Major"</u>

Equipment hardware not available to Citywide staff or will require a certified vendor to complete work. (Example: assembly parts specific to manufacturer)



FINDING 3: THE PARK AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT NEEDS A COMPREHENSIVE AND ACCURATE ASSESSMENT OF THE PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT

- Efforts to accurately assess playground equipment has been accomplished through enhanced oversight of playground inspections.
- Inventory of playground equipment and surfacing is part of the evaluation and low-frequency processes.



FINDING 3 (cont.)

- Park & Recreation Department currently has nine (9) Certified Playground Safety Inspectors (CPSI).
- All 256 playgrounds in the Department were evaluated by a CPSI staff member this year.
- Manager Plus will go live within the Department early 2015.



FINDING 3 (cont.)

- Park Condition Assessments are currently underway for specific park assets, including playgrounds:
 - 30 parks in first group (reporting phase)
 - ⁻ 40 parks in second group (pre-planning phase)
- Condition Assessments examine playground viability and usability, while regular inspections examine playground safety



Summary

Safety for park patrons is the Department's number one priority, including minimizing risk at playgrounds. While the Department has always inspected playgrounds to ensure park patron safety, the Department is committed to improving based on the Office of City Auditor recommendations.

Over the past several months, the Department has made considerable progress in the ability to inspect, inventory, and assess playgrounds, including the following initiatives:

- In spring 2014, eight (8) employees received their California Parks and Recreation Society Certified Playground Safety Inspectors accreditations .
- Certified inspectors have evaluated and inspected over 256 playgrounds (defined as an area with play equipment joined together by contiguous soft surfacing such as sand, fibar, and/or rubberized surface that is not separated by a hard surface such as a sidewalk or barrier) within the park system during summer 2014.
- Intake staff have inputted every park playground into Manager Plus, the newly implemented computer based program gives the Department an ability to track all playground service requests, repairs, and evaluations.
- Certified staff will train onsite staff in both classroom and field environments related to playground safety and inspections.
