Key Elements of City's Drought Ordinance December 2, 2008



- Establishes targets / triggers for each level when a specific amount of consumer demand reduction is required
 - Level 1 (voluntary) up to 10% reduction
 - Level 2 (mandatory)- up to 20%
 - Level 3 (mandatory) up to 40%
 - Level 4 (mandatory) greater than 40%
- Demand reductions called for by CWA can be based upon a number of factors:
 - Cutbacks from Metropolitan Water District
 - CWA regional local supplies
 - Availability of member agency local storage
 - Current conservation savings being achieved
 - Ability of CWA to secure supplemental supplies
- City reductions will be reflective of our own local supplies



City's Drought Ordinance





Level 1 (↑ 10% Reduction)

- Currently found in City's "Stage 1 Water Watch"
- Voluntary Restrictions:
 - Washing down paved surfaces
 - Shut-off valves on hoses
 - Restaurants water only upon request
 - Hotels optional laundering of linens





City's Drought Ordinance





Level 2 (↑ 20% Reduction)

- Mandatory Restrictions:
 - All Level 1 restrictions:
 - Summer landscape irrigation to 3 days/week
 - Winter landscape irrigation to 1 day/week
 - 10 minutes/station
 - Washing your car, use a bucket and a hose with a shut-off nozzle between 6pm and 10am
 - Turn off water fountains
 - Repair leaks in 72 hours

City's Drought Ordinance



Level 2 (↑ 20% Reduction) – Support

- Resources Allocated to Response Effort
 - Hiring 10 full-time, limited positions to manage the enforcement and complaint process
 - Public utility staff to be trained to observe and report water waste or violations of behavior modification requirements
 - All City staff to be trained on modifications required at City facilities
 - Door hangers and other materials to be developed for use by staff and public
 - Tracking system to be implemented for complaints
- Hardship Variance and Cost Recovery Fee
 - Undue hardship
 - \$25, 50 and \$100 based on size of meter



City's Drought Ordinance



- Level 3 (↑ 40% Reduction) Mandatory Restrictions:
 - All Level 2 restrictions, plus:
 - No new potable water service will be provided, nor temporary or permanent meters issued
 - Summer landscape irrigation reduced to 2 days/week
 - No (re)filling of ornamental lakes, ponds, residential pools and spas
 - Car washing at commercial carwashes only (that re-circulate water)
 - Repair of water leaks within 48 hours

Level 4 (40%+ Reduction) Mandatory Restrictions:

- All Level 3 restrictions, plus:
- All landscape irrigation is stopped, except in unique and limited circumstances
- All water leaks are to be repaired within 24 hours
