To Whom It May Concern:

A nomination form has been submitted to Save Our Heritage Organisation (SOHO) for a People in Preservation (PIP) Award for individuals and organizations involved in the successful placement of the North Park Water Tower and the entire University Heights Water Storage and Pumping Station Historic District on the National Register of Historic Places in June of 2013.

The nomination recommends that Alex Bevil, who prepared the application packet on a pro-bono basis, the North Park Historical Society (NPHS), the University Heights Historical Society, and McKinley Elementary School be recognized for their efforts. NPHS was the applicant organization, University Heights Historical Society (through Ernie Bonn), provided additional community support, and McKinley Elementary (through support from Ms. Phillips and her fifth grade students) provided critical evidence of community support for the application as it went forward.

Dear NORTH PARK PLANNING COMMITTEE:

The City of San Diego is working with its corporate partner, DECOBIKE SAN DIEGO, to bring a new bike sharing program to neighborhoods across the City. The program is scheduled to begin this summer and your community is one of the first to be selected for bike sharing stations.

Attached is information about the proposed stations to be placed within your community and the overall program.

Similar letters are being sent in tandem to property owners and businesses that are scheduled to have a bike station installed immediately in front of or adjacent to their property. Installation of each station will take less than one day and crews will do all they can to minimize impacts during the installation process.

Each station will provide bicycles for shared public use at low cost. Other stations will be conveniently located around town allowing riders to check out and return bicycles as needed. The goal is to connect bicyclists to local businesses, nearby attractions and public transportation. Our hope is that the program will reduce parking and traffic congestion while also improving community health.

As more and more travelers choose bikes for transportation, the City is excited to be working with community members and other agencies to improve access to this low-cost healthy transportation option.

Commemorate SOHO's 45th anniversary by supporting the weekend events: Friday evening, June 6 is the annual People In Preservation Awards; Saturday, June 7 there will be three architectural walking tours; and on Sunday, June 8 the Historic Home Tour will showcase five of North Park's great historic houses.

The historic Sunset Temple will be our venue this year, and if you have never been to this speakeasy style locale you are in for a treat. Celebrate and pay tribute to those who embody the best in preservation in San Diego County.

The PIP awards are an opportunity for fellow San Diegans to recognize the efforts of the work that property owners do in preserving the historic resources of our region. People In Preservation encourages historic preservation and acknowledges that good preservation can be found in the restoration of the most modest residence to the grandest mansion, from our earliest structures to mid-century contributions, and includes both the private and the public sector.

Each of the walking tours is offered at 9am, 11am, and 1pm so you can do all three if you want!

These three 90-minute walking tours will benefit the North Park Historical Society, our community partners this year. Limited admissions make for quality tours, so buy your tickets in advance. Tours are led by the researchers and creators of the tours. All walking tours are of exteriors only.

Streetcar Suburb at Hamilton Walking Tour

This approximately 1-mile guided walking tour highlights both residential and commercial architecture, including the 1927 Tudor Revival McClure House, a 1921 apartment court, and the Cadillac Apartments, constructed in 1925 of bricks made locally in Rose Canyon. The original location and purpose of the popular Carnitas Snack Shack restaurant building will be revealed and the iconic Water Tower, listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2013, is also on the tour.

The streetcar on the #7 line did not stop at every corner along University Avenue, but it did stop just west of Hamilton Street where heavy foot traffic made it an ideal place for stores and offices to set up shop here. The stop at Hamilton Street became the center of a new working class neighborhood where residents could walk quickly to the streetcar. The area provided a range of homes, from California Bungalows on separate lots to bungalow courts and apartments. Streetcar suburbs like this one were how San Diego grew in the early part of the 20th Century. A guidebook is included with the tour.

Dryden Historic District Walking Tour

The six-block neighborhood along 28th Street and Pershing Avenue from Upas to Landis Streets was designated as the North Park Dryden Historic District in 2011. On this 1-mile stroll, guides will discuss the variety of architectural styles represented in the neighborhood. This area developed from 1912 to 1941, with most homes being completed by the 1920s. The included guidebook highlights 30 homes, many built by Master Builder David Owen Dryden.

Morley Field Walking Tour

This tour covers more than a dozen sites of interest on a 1.5-mile loop within the Morley Field Recreation Area. Long considered North Park's backyard, the eastern mesa of Balboa Park encompasses lush green lawns, towering eucalyptus trees, and multiple active recreational facilities, including tennis courts, softball fields, a disc golf course, bicycle velodrome, swimming pool, and archery range. The area was named for John G. Morley, who was Superintendent of Parks for the City of San Diego from 1911 to 1938. Architectural highlights include the 1933 Bud Kearns Memorial pool building designed by Herman Louis Bodmer, who worked for William Templeton Johnson in 1926 and opened his own firm in 1930, and the 1960s tennis clubhouse designed by Sim Bruce Richards, a prominent San Diego architect who is on the city's list of master architects.

Tour the interiors of five historic houses in North Park. The self-driven tour features homes with an exciting diversity of architectural styles ranging from a 1916 Prairie School with Mission Revival influences and a 1916 classic two-story Craftsman, to a 1924 Mission Revival with a rare brick-clad exterior. North Park is home to one of San Diego's finest historic Main Streets as well as a rich and vibrant community of bungalows and Craftsman homes highlighted by the recently approved Dryden Historic District and grand Spanish Revival homes bordering Morley Field. Historic homes by David Owen Dryden, Alexander Schreiber and Edward F. Bryans, all master builders, are just three of the homes that visitors will tour this year. This year's historic home tour is a must see for architectural lovers!

The Annual Historic Home Tour Weekend is an important fundraiser for SOHO. Funds raised benefit SOHO's work of promoting preservation of the architectural, cultural, and historical links and landmarks that contribute to the community identity, depth and character of the San Diego region.
