

Minutes of the Monthly Meeting of the

Community Members Allen Young, Derek Applbaum, Ray Higgins, Joyce Temporal, Mark Olsson, Richard Vernon, Ed Quinn, Rakesh Goyal, Sonny Patidar and Daniel Burakowski were also present.

The Meeting was brought to order at 12:05 PM by Jeff Sallen, Chairman of the Kearny Mesa Planning Group who acted as the Chair of the Meeting. Copies of the Minutes of the February 18, 2015 meeting were distributed and discussed. After the members reviewed the minutes, Jeff asked for any changes or corrections. There was one change regarding an incorrect date. Upon a motion and seconded, those minutes of the May meeting were approved with the one change (8-0-0).

The Chair continued the meeting by asking each Board Member with an expiring term to stand and introduce themselves. Following the existing members introductions, community members, Richard Vernon, Ed Quinn, Mark Olsson and Derek Applbaum all stood and spoke on who they were and their relationship to Kearny Mesa. Jeff passed out ballots to the audience and asked for a vote. Members elected for a new two year term include, John Turpit (Michael Merrill Architecture & Planning), Tana Lorah (Kaiser Permanente), Mark Stevens (Stevens Cresto Engineering, Inc.), Peter Fayette (Hickman Field Rep), Ray Richmond (Crownair Aviation), Richard Vernon (Community Member/Resident), Ed Quinn (Montgomery Field Business Association) and Mark Olsson (See Scan).

Moving quickly to Action Items, Skyler Denniston (Senior Land Use Manager) with Kaiser Permanente came back to present for a second time on the Kaiser Medical Centers new signage plans. The Neighborhood Use Permit was approved 8-0-0.

The second and final Action Item of the day was presented by Rakesh Goyal seeking a CUP for a MMCC located at 2,366 square feet. This was the third time Rakesh presented in front of the Kearny Mesa Planning Group. The CUP was approved with the understanding that the permit would be issued for two year rather than five (7-2-0).
