Alternative Strategies

Dear Kelly:

As you are aware wireless telecommunication carriers have started an assertive push into the single family neighborhoods of La Jolla and other communities. The La Jolla Community Planning Association (CPA) intends to be pro-active and work closely with the carriers and the City. At the same time, we are charged with making recommendations to the City on land use matters and must represent the best interests of the community and its constituents. The CPA has formed an ad hoc committee and initiated conversations with City staff and one carrier.

The CPA is exploring an overall plan for wireless facilities that incorporates the use of Distributed Antenna Systems (DAS) as provided by NextG, Extenet Systems, and perhaps others. It offers the opportunity for a winwin for the carriers and the community. The carriers would be able to move forward with a minimal approval process, saving them a great deal of money and time and making the process more predictable. The community would have a standardized system that minimizes the impact of wireless facilities on neighborhoods and individual homes. DAS appears to be a very real option that respects both City and Federal laws although it requires cooperation from all parties involved.

We are aware of the urgency for carriers to move forward as mandated by the Federal Government and that the City has control over Time, Manner, and Place. We request that the City place ALL current applications from ALL carriers on hold for a short time. Furthermore, the CPA requests assistance from the City to explore DAS as an alternative that can meet the needs of the carriers, the City, and the community and be the exclusive wireless antenna system throughout La Jolla and perhaps other communities as well.

Re: Children's Pool Lifeguard Interim Tower

Honorable Mayor Sanders:

We, the presidents of the La Jolla organizations protest the installation of the Children's Pool Lifeguard Interim Tower. This intrusive installation was conceived and design without benefit of any public input nor consideration of the impact on protected public views and the public's use of this important coastal access. It violates the Municipal Code and the Coastal Plan. The lack of process calls into question whether there is a positive working relationship between your office and our community.

We are united in this stance because this is not just a land use issue; it is a public park issue, a coastal access issue, a tourist issue, and affects residents and merchants alike.

We hold the lifeguards in high regards and appreciate the extraordinary job they do as they place the public's health, safety, and welfare ahead of their own on a daily basis. Nevertheless that should not be used as a shield against the community's participation in the design of an extraordinary structure in a very public place.

Given the city's budget challenges and the inability to enter the bond market, this "interim" tower could very likely be in place for a year or more so we do not take this matter lightly.

We ask that you direct staff to work with the La Jolla community to find the minimum interim structure that will serve the lifeguards and satisfy the concerns raised above with a commitment to adjust the size, height, and fencing of the current structure accordingly.

While there are daunting challenges that face our city, we must not lose sight that these day-to-day decisions have a profound impact on the quality of life of our community and the city and sacrifice the good will of the citizenry for short-term operational gains.
