Children's Pool - Coastal Development Permit and Site Development Permit to demolish existing lifeguard station and construct a new 1,899 sf lifeguard station.

Jilhad Slieman, City of San Diego Capital Project presenting.

Morton: revised ramp design is 7ft. wided. Is this wide enough for emergency vehicles – YES.

Is ramp open to sand? There is a gate at then of ramp that is outside the scope of this project. It is a Park & Rec.

issue. Flag pole location will be in the plaza.

Gabsch: Workstations & observation room are too big for their intended use.

Collins: Kitchen is too big.

Crisafi: Toured P.B. Lifeguard Station on Garnet and felt that room sizes are appropriate. The revised ramp location further enhances site. Concerned about building height. According to LDC this structure is over the 30ft. height limit. Costello: Bluff erosion preservation.

Little: There is not much activity to lifeguard here and this is definitely more of an administrative building. Proposes researching another location.

Brady: Merten's plan to 3 level.

Lucas: square footages seem reasonable but requests further explanation of Crisafi's height calculations.

Peto: Supports project as is.

Weiss: Not convinced it is a lifeguard building, but rather and administrative office. Opposes project.

Metcalf: Believes the city has made the changes CPA has requested.

Approved motion: to approve project with the following conditions:

- 1. The roof be adjusted to meet the 30' height limit.
- 2. There is a provision that if the Coastal commission rejects the ramp, that an ADA accessible restroom facility is added to the plaza level.
- 3. The gate at end of ramp be opened as a second beach access point.
- 4. That there is bluff mitigation for erosion.

Adrian McKibbon: please clarify type of granite proposed.

13. **DANIELS RESIDENCE**

PRC ACTION: DENY PROJECT BECAUSE FINDINGS CANNOT BE MADE TO SUPPORT BASED ON BULK & SCALE AND FAILURE TO ADEQUATELY COMMUNICATE WITH ALL NEIGHBOR(S), 3-2-0.

Pulled by the public.

7907 Princess Street - 2,259 square foot addition to existing single family residence comprised of new second story over part of existing first story, new basement area below expanded garage to allow for 3 cars and associated site walls and balconies.

Presentation by Tony Crisafi, Island Architects, Matt Peterson.

Presentation of opposition by Phil Merten: on behalf of neighbors opposed to project re: setback issues, bulk & scale, FAR. Spoke in opposition: Adrian McKibbon, Roger Craig.

Public comment: Janie Noon, neighbor: the design is best possible taking her home into consideration. Plan is more acceptable than other options she has seen over the years.

Morton: What amount of ridge height that has been reduced? How tall is the new Southwest corner in comparison to existing cupola?

Little: existing building is out of compliance, bulk & scale concerns.

Lucas: can some upper level bathrooms be removed to reduce FAR?

Collins: explain "Previously Conforming" terminology.

Ashley: conflicts with regard to preserving historic buildings vs. tear downs to accomplish conformance to current codes.

Brady: Reynolds neighbors wrote letter stating they have not been contacted by Island Architects.

Failed Motion: To approve project as presented on the basis that the historic character is being preserved. (Peto/Metcalf 6-7-0)

In favor: Ashley, Brady, Lucas, Metcalf, Morton, Peto

Opposed: Berol, Collins, Costello, Fitzgerald, Gabsch, Little, Weiss

Recused: Crisafi.

Gabsch: opposes because FAR is too large, princess street side projects too much, out of character for neighborhood

with regards to bulk & scale. Fitzgerald: Bulk & scale too big. Weiss: agrees with Gabsch
