Water Purification Demonstration Project presentation: The City of San Diego's Water Purification Demonstration Project examined the use of advanced water purification technology on high quality recycled wastewater, and ultimately has determined that purified water can be produced and safely added to San Vicente Reservoir as part of a full-scale potable reuse project. A full-scale project in San Diego would diversify our water supply,
