# ITEM #1 CALL TO ORDER – REGULAR MEETING:

Meeting called to order 7:03 pm by Richard House, Chair. <u>In attendance:</u> John Cochran, Fred Gahm, Robin Kaufman, Roberta Mikles, Wolfie Pores, Richard House, Matt Stockton, Joe Dirks, Lou Dell'Angela, Vicki Touchstone, Kim Coutts, Mike Lutz. <u>Absent</u>: Peter Tereschuck, Glen Vaughan, Eugenia Contratto. <u>ARC</u>: Teri Denlinger. A quorum was met: 13 our of 16 members were present.

#### ITEM #2 NON-AGENDA PUBLIC COMMENT:

- **-Oaks North Resident, Paul Heeter,** presented speeding concerns at the intersection of Paseo Del Verano North and Camino Ancho. The issue will be reviewed by the traffic committee.
- -Councilman Kersey's representative, Tiffany Vinson reported Camino Del Norte will be resurfaced by the end of the year; local police can now use the RB police storefront office after library hours; and the Councilman authored a neighborhood input policy. Roberta Mikles addressed concerns of potholes on Pomerado Rd. Robin Kaufman asked about the Burger King/McDonald's conversion process after being contacted by a number of residents. Tiffany said she would look into the matter.

-Motion made Fred Gahm/Vicki Touchstone to approve agenda as is - motion passed unanimously.

#### **ITEM #5 ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS:**

- -Review, and approve June 20, 2013, minutes: A motion was made Robin Kaufman/Joe Dirks to accept minutes adding a copy of the written document presented at the June meeting by Ron Stevens, an Oaks North Board of Directors member, at the end of the minutes. Motion passed 12-0-1 (Kim Coutts abstained as she was not in attendance at the June meeting).
- **-Review and approve June 20, 2013, Treasurer's report:** Fred Gahm, Treasurer, reported a balance of \$816.34 in the grant account and \$427.63 in the regular account. Motion made Fred Gahm/Vicki Touchstone to accept report. Motion passed unanimously.

# ITEM #7 REALLOCATION OF FUNDS FROM THE RB FOUNDATION:

-Richard House presented details on research he did for obtaining a P.A. system. The full system, which would include six wired microphones, a mixer, cables, jacks, etc., would cost \$503.00. Richard informed the group he had spoken to the Swim and Tennis Club manager. The club is willing to contribute \$200.00 towards the purchase of the P.A. system, with the club being able to use the unit and store it for us. After some discussion and concerns raised by members, a motion was made by John Cochran/Roberta Mikles to table this matter until further information can be obtained. John will speak with other groups and gather more information on sound systems they may be using. Motion passed 9-4-0 (Against: Wolfie Pores, Matt Stockton, Mike Lutz, Richard House).

# ITEM #8 PROPOSED PROJECT RANKINGS FOR THE NEWLY REVISED RB PFFP AND PRELIMINARY DRAFT OF THE RB PFFP:

-Vicki Touchstone distributed documents and gave an update on the suggested, revised draft PFFP (see attached documents). Vicki reported the City is in the process of a storm drain study which should be completed by the end of the year. A motion was made Vicki Touchstone/Lou Dell'Angela to approve the ranking as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

#### ITEM #9 ESTABLISH A "WAYS & MEANS" COMMITTEE:

-Richard House commented Robin Kaufman and Vicki Touchstone had informed him we used to have a Ways and Means Committee which helped educate the public of our group and solicited contributions to help with our financial needs. Robin Kaufman had suggested this possibly fall under the PR committee as the goal is to help educate the community about our group. Kim Coutts expressed concern that since she is chair of the PR committee and a new member, it may be too much for her to take on at this time and would prefer this to be a separate committee. Richard asked for volunteers to be on the committee. No one volunteered, so there will be no Ways and Means committee at this time.

-Richard House commented that Robin Kaufman had informed him the initial concept of having representatives for each district is to have our representatives attend their HOA and/or club meetings, inform them of our present issues and report back to our board on any issues in each district. Motion made Richard House/Roberta Mikles to have one district per month to give a report, starting with Wolfie Pores and/or Roberta Mikles presenting a brief report on Oaks North at the August Board meeting. Motion passed 12-0-1 (Joe Dirks, representative of Seven Oaks abstained as he works at the time Seven Oaks conducts their monthly meeting and would not be able to attend. He might be able to attend Remington's meetings if they do not conflict with his work schedule).

- In July the RB Maintenance Assessment District (MAD) will be in existence and under the purview of the RB Community Council for 30 years.
- - Due to the July 4th holiday, MAD was canceled.
- 187 residents who stopped by the RBCC RB Alive booth took time to take a 10 question survey which will better assist the RBCC in serving the community. The questions ranged from street maintenance, need to build more parks and fire stations, SDG&E issues, and more.
- RBCC had elections in June –with 146 people voting at RB Alive, and less than 30 voting at other locations. There are six new members.

- RBCC dealt with a large amount of graffiti, which was removed in less than 24 hours.
- RBCC dealt with several code compliance issues, which were dealt with within 5 working days.
- RBCC will be hosting a 'meet and greet 'County Supervisor Dave Roberts Thursday, July 25, 6 pm at the RB library large meeting room. Light refreshments will be served. He will then give a brief presentation on issues at 6:30 pm.
- -The Public Safety Committee requested safety striping at the southbound RB Rd exit. There are two right turning lanes from the off ramp onto RB Road. They do not have striping indicating two separate lanes, which have caused traffic issues. At the request of the Public Safety Committee, Caltrans will be striping the lanes by the end of the month.
