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WALK FOR PROJECT WORKING GROUP

- 1. Meet at St. Paul's Cathedral, 2750 Fifth Avenue, at 3:30 p.m.
- 2. Board Northbound Bus #3 (local) or #120 (express) at NE corner of Fifth Ave and Nutmeg St.
- 3. Get off the Bus at the SE corner of University Avenue and Fifth Ave.
- 4. Walking north on Fifth Ave, cross University and walk to corner of Fifth & Washington: LOCATION #1 OBSERVE / DISCUSS
- 5. Cross Washington over to the hospital and walk slightly West to the other intersection with Fifth Avenue: LOCATION #1 OBSERVE / DISCUSS
- 6. Walk West 1 block along Washington; cross Fourth Avenue; then immediately turn south and cross Washington at Fourth Avenue: LOCATION #2 OBSERVE / DISCUSS
- 7. Walk South down Fourth, cross University Ave (note advance Ped walk signal), and board Southbound Bus #3 or #120.
- 8. Get off the Bus just South of Upas Street (only ONE stop if on the #120!)
- 9. Walk North up Fourth Avenue to intersection with Walnut: LOCATION #3 OBSERVE / DISCUSS
- 10. Walk South down Fourth Avenue to the Bus Stop at Upas: LOCATION #3 OBSERVE / DISCUSS
- 11. Board Southbound Bus #3 (NOT the express 120!) Get off the Bus at the SW corner of Nutmeg and Fourth Ave: LOCATION #4 OBSERVE / DISCUSS
- 12. Walk east along Nutmeg, crossing Fifth and Sixth avenues: LOCATION #4 OBSERVE / DISCUSS
- 13. Along east side of Sixth Ave (adjacent to Park), walk North up toward Quince St., stopping at cross street intersections as needed: LOCATION #5 OBSERVE / DISCUSS
- 14. OPTIONAL: If time permits, at Quince Street, turn West and walk to intersection with Fifth Ave: LOCATION #6 OBSERVE / DISCUSS; otherwise, Walk ends at St. Paul's Cathedral.
- 15. OPTIONAL: If time permits, continue West on Quince St to the Quince footbridge at Fourth Ave: LOCATION #6 OBSERVE / DISCUSS; otherwise, Walk ends at St. Paul's Cathedral.
