










# Original Subdivisions & Block Patterns




### **Growth Periods**


- 78% of singlefamily homes and 67% of multi-family built between 1910 and 1948 (up to1970)
- 1880-1909 greatest share of multi-family housing
- 1949 1970 most evenly-distributed growth by use and location












### **Predominant Styles**


















#### Dominant Character Areas

#### **Mission Hills**


- High concentration of significant styles
- Early single-family housing boom
- Square, short, and irregular canyon blocks typical of early platting
- High degree of integrity

#### **University Heights**

- · High concentration of significant styles
- Early single-family housing boom
- Long blocks, irregular blocks and early mixed-use development
- Diverse mix of periods and styles
- · Smaller lots, higher intensity single-family

#### Hillcrest, South of Robinson

- Diversity of historic styles
- Intact residential areas adjacent to mixed use, developed corridors
- Long blocks aligned to predominant corridors




#### **Bankers Hill Avenues**

- Mixed use character from earliest development
- Greatest diversity of architectural styles, including early styles
- Distinct character from other Uptown areas with office, highrise development
- Transitional to downtown, short block pattern
- Concentration of multi-family
