



The City of San Diego is developing a Pedestrian Master Plan (PMP) to guide the planning and implementation of pedestrian improvement projects. The Pedestrian Master Plan will help the City enhance neighborhood quality and mobility options by facilitating pedestrian improvement projects. The PMP will identify and prioritize improvement projects based on technical analysis and community input as well as improve the City's ability to receive grant funding for implementation of pedestrian projects.



The City, in consultation with RBF Consulting, is currently in Phase 4 of the planning process. During Phase 1, the City developed the PMP-Citywide Framework Report which provides a foundation for identifying and prioritizing projects in each community. The PMP-Citywide Framework Report was completed in December 2006 and is available online at: <http://www.sandiego.gov/planning/programs/transportation/pdf/pmpfv.pdf>.



Phases 2 and 3 inventoried seven communities in the city to understand pedestrian needs, identify problems, and create a prioritized list of pedestrian projects specific to each community. Phase 4 continues the inventory process and focuses on seven additional communities:

- College
- Kensington/Talmadge
- Midway/Pacific Highway
- Old San Diego
- Ocean Beach
- Pacific Beach
- San Ysidro



As the Pedestrian Master Plan Community Chapters are developed, the City will hold public workshops to collect community input. Please participate in helping to improve the pedestrian environment and increase opportunities to choose walking as a mode of transportation.
