Detectives looking for Leads in Road Rage Incidents; One Victim Shot in the Leg

Release Date: December 12, 2006

San Diego County Crime Stoppers, working with the San Diego Police Department's Mid-City detectives, is seeking the public's assistance to identify the suspect responsible for three separate road rage incidents.

Between December 5, and December 7, 2006, an unknown Hispanic male, driving a Toyota Sequoia SUV, was involved in three separate road rage incidents. Two of the incidents resulted in the suspect shooting and hitting the victim's vehicles; a third incident resulted in the victim being shot in the leg; just missing his femoral artery. In all three cases the suspect used a large caliber handgun. Each incident happened within a half-mile of the intersection of Home and Euclid Avenues. The victims say that the suspect chases them or cuts them off, without any provocation. Additionally, the suspect does not get out of his car when he shoots at the victims.

Suspect Info: Hispanic male, 25-30 years-old with short hair and a thin mustache.

Suspect Vehicle Info: Late model (charcoal grey or possibly light brown or tan) Toyota Sequoia SUV. The vehicle has tinted windows and a flat rear spoiler above the rear window. The vehicle should have damage to the left rear wheel well and the left rear door.

Anyone with information on the identity of the suspect in these road rage incidents is asked to call the **Crime Stoppers anonymous tip line at (888) 580-TIPS**. Crime Stoppers is offering up to a \$1,000 reward to anyone with information that leads to the arrest of the suspect. Collect calls are accepted and callers may remain anonymous.
