San Diego County Crime Stoppers, working with the San Diego Sheriff's Department's Homicide Unit and Jane Kling's family, are asking for the public's assistance to help identify and locate the person(s) responsible for the murder of Jane Kling. Crime Stoppers and the Kling family have now increased their combined reward to a total of \$10,000.

Jane Kling was murdered on March 24, 2006. Her body was found in Campo Cimmarron, near Puertocitos, about 45 minutes south of San Felipe. Kling's 1997 Dodge Caravan was found in the area where her body was discovered. She was apparently strangled but not sexually assaulted or robbed. All of her belongings, including money and credit cards were found nearby.

The Mexican authorities have released a sketch of a person that was seen with Jane Kling at the Hotel Costa Azul in San Felipe, Mexico. The sketch is attached to this release.

Anyone with information on the identity and location of the person(s) responsible for this crime is asked to call the **Crime Stoppers anonymous tip line at (888) 580-TIPS**. Crime Stoppers is offering up to a \$10,000 reward to anyone with information that leads to the arrest of the suspect. Collect calls are accepted and callers may remain anonymous.

Members of Jane Kling's family, as well as Sgt Roy Frank, will be available today at the Crime Stoppers Enough Is Enough Luncheon and Awards Ceremony at the Doubletree Hotel (Hazard Center in Mission Valley) from 11-2 p.m.

For information leading to an arrest, you could receive up to a \$1,000 reward and remain anonymous. The qualification of any person(s) for the reward and the amount of the reward for any person(s) so qualifying will be determined by San Diego County Crime Stoppers, Inc. in its sole discretion.
