San Diego County Crime Stoppers is joining forces with San Diego Police Department's Traffic Division to help apprehend the suspects responsible for a felony hit and run collision.

On August 10, 2007 at about 9:40 p.m. a dark colored vehicle was driving west on Grand Avenue near Cass Street. Two women stepped out into the path of the vehicle and were struck. After the collision, the driver of the car left the scene traveling north on Bayard. There were two occupants in car described as white females. The two pedestrians sustained serious injuries and have undergone surgery.

The suspect vehicle is a dark Nissan or Audi sedan with custom rims and tinted windows.

Crime Stoppers is offering up to a **\$1,000** reward to anyone with information that leads to an arrest in this felony hit and run case.
