Santee Sheriff's Investigators Are Asking For the Public's Help to Identify and Apprehend Two Burglary Suspects Caught on Tape

San Diego County Crime Stoppers is joining forces with San Diego County Sheriff's Department's Santee detectives to help identify and apprehend the suspects responsible for burglarizing vehicles in the Santee and Encinitas areas. Two suspects were caught on a store surveillance tape using credit cards that were stolen during those burglaries.

Detectives think that the suspects may be targeting local gyms, waiting in the parking lots, watching the patron to see what they do with their purses. In at least one of the vehicle burglaries the female victim got out of her car and locked her purse in the trunk before entering the gym. When she returned to her vehicle she noticed that the trunk has been broken into and her credit cards had been stolen.

The unidentified suspects, a man and a woman, have used the stolen credit cards at local stores in Santee, Kearny Mesa and Encinitas. The suspects were caught on tape during one of their shopping sprees.
