The family of Federico "Rico" Borjas has asked that the following information be shared with the media regarding the public viewing, funeral and burial. Their primary request is that the privacy of family members, friends, fellow servicemen and fellow officers be respected. Media are asked not to enter the church to photograph or videotape during the viewing or the funeral.

The funeral will take place at The Rock Church, 2277 Rosecrans Street, San Diego on Wednesday, October 29 from noon to approximately 1:30 p.m. (see below for full schedule).

Special Note: Parking for live trucks only at The Rock Church will be set aside on Womble Street between Truxtun Road and Rosecrans Street.

The burial will take place at Fort Rosecrans National Cemetery. The media policy of FRNC is that media may maintain a respectful distance at the monument (main gate area) to photograph/videotape the military ceremony which will take place at the monument but once the family moves to the actual burial site, media are asked to respect the privacy of the family. Also, media are asked not to photograph/videotape individual headstones at FRNC.

- Wednesday, October 29, 2008 between 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. public viewing Funeral begins at noon and will conclude at approximately 1:30 p.m.
- Interment will take place between 2 and 3 p.m. at Fort Rosecrans National Cemetery, 1800 Cabrillo Memorial Drive

We would like to thank his friends, work colleagues, and his fellow Soldiers at the 416th Civil Affairs Battalion, for their sincere expressions of sympathy during this very difficult time.

Your support is appreciated as we mourn the loss of our son who was a devoted father, a caring son, dedicated police officer and a selfless Soldier.
