Robbery Suspects Sought

Up to \$1,000 Reward Offered

UPDATE: Today at about 1 p.m., in the 3000 block of Island Avenue Central Division officers arrested three males believed responsible for this series. Two are juveniles and one is 18 years of age.

Detectives are in the process of interviewing these suspects and they will eventually be booked into the SD Central Jail and Juvenile Hall.

San Diego County Crime Stoppers is joining forces with the San Diego Police Department's Central & Southeastern Division detectives to help apprehend the suspects responsible for several pedestrian robberies that have occurred in November and December.

The suspects are targeting Hispanic females who are walking alone in the Mountain View, Valencia Park, Grant Hill and Logan Heights neighborhoods. The suspects snatch gold chains from around the victims' necks and flee on foot. The victims are all in their 30s and 40s.
