San Diego County Crime Stoppers, working with the San Diego Police Department Financial Crimes Unit, is seeking any information regarding an unidentified male and female suspect wanted for credit card theft.

On December 14, 2008 the victim (a real estate agent) held an open house in the Carmel Valley area of San Diego. The victim placed their wallet inside a briefcase, which was located in the kitchen. The suspect took the victim's drivers license, debit card and credit card, then returned the wallet back to the briefcase. The cards were subsequently used in the Mira Mesa area at Best Buy, Ralph's, GNC and Albertson's. While the suspects were in Best Buy, they were captured on surveillance cameras.

The suspects are described as:

Suspect #1 is a white male, 6'0"-6'1", medium build, late 30's early 40's. He has short blond hair and is wearing a white polo shirt and blue jeans. Suspect #2 is a white female, 5'4"-5'6", regular build, late 30's to early 40's. She has brown shoulder length hair.

Anyone with any information on the identity and location of these two suspects is asked to call the **Crime Stoppers anonymous tip line at (888) 580-8477**. Crime Stoppers is offering up to a \$1,000 reward to anyone with information that leads to a felony arrest.
