



Detectives Looking for Leads to Help Identify and Locate Two Suspects Wanted for a Purse Snatch

Up to \$1,000 Reward Offered

San Diego County Crime Stoppers and investigators from the San Diego Police Department's Central Division are asking for assistance from the public to help identify and locate at least two suspects wanted for a purse snatch.

Detectives said on September 19, 2011, at approximately 8:00 p.m., a female victim was sitting in the outside patio of the Haji Baba Café at 801 C Street in downtown San Diego. An unknown suspect reached into the patio and grabbed the victim's purse. The suspect was with a group of male and female young adults and was last seen running towards 1000 Broadway. A short time later, two suspects were caught on surveillance camera's located at the Jack in the Box and McDonalds near San Diego City College. The suspects used the stolen credit cards from the victim's purse at both locations.

Suspect #1: Black male, 18-20 years old, 5'6"-5'8" tall, medium build, wearing a black t-shirt, tan cargo shorts, black socks, and black shoes.

Suspect #2: Black male, 18-20 years old, 6'-6'2" tall, dreadlock hair style, glasses, thin build, wearing a light blue t-shirt.
