



Unknown Suspects Sought for Pedestrian Robbery Series; Surveillance Camera Captures Picture of Suspects

Up to \$1,000 Reward Offered

San Diego County Crime Stoppers and Investigators from the San Diego Police Department's Northeastern Division are asking for assistance from the public to help identify at least three unknown suspects wanted for a pedestrian robbery series in Mira Mesa.

Investigators said between January 06 - 12, 2011, there have been at least four pedestrian robberies in the community of Mira Mesa. Investigators believe all four robberies were committed by the same suspects. In every case at least one of the suspects has been armed with a handgun; the victims have not yet been injured. The suspects appear to be targeting cash, credit cards, cell phones and iPods.

*The victim's stolen credit cards were used by the suspects at several nearby stores. The stores had surveillance cameras and were able to capture several pictures of the suspects. **Copies of the videos are available today at the SDPD Headquarters Broadway side front counter.***

Suspect Descriptions:

All three suspects are Hispanic males, 16-20 years-old.

Suspect Vehicle:

Older Honda Civic (or similar style), 4-door, possibly silver in color with a sunroof.
