### **ARMED SUSPECTS WANTED FOR CRICKET WIRELESS ROBBERY**

**(San Diego)** San Diego Police Department Robbery Unit detectives are investigating an armed commercial robbery that occurred last week at the Cricket Wireless store located at 4340 Genesee Avenue in the Clairemont Mesa West area.

On Thursday, September 6, 2012, just before 11:00 a.m., two suspects entered the Cricket Wireless store and approached the employee who was standing behind the cash register. The primary suspect pulled a long barreled black revolver from his waistband and pointed it at the clerk, demanding money from the register. The second suspect stood by the primary suspect during the robbery. The victim gave the primary suspect the money and both suspects walked out of the business. The suspects were seen getting into a small white pickup truck, similar to a Ford Ranger with a ladder in the bed. The loss was only cash from the business.

The primary suspect is described as a Hispanic male with a goatee, about 35 years of age, 5'6 and weighing 180 pounds. He was wearing a gray t-shirt with a design on the front, white painter's style pants and brown work boots. He also wore a black baseball cap and dark sunglasses. He was armed with a large, long-barreled black revolver.

The second suspect is described as a Hispanic male with a slight mustache, about 45 years of age. He is 5'4 and weighs 150 pounds. He wore a blue t-shirt with the word "JUMP" in orange letters on the back, jeans and black tennis shoes.

The suspects were captured on surveillance video inside the store and out in the parking lot. Copies of the videos are available at the San Diego Police Department Headquarters Broadway customer service counter.
