SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY REPORTED IN THE VICINITY OF SAN YSIDRO HIGH SCHOOL

(San Diego) Southern Division Juvenile Services Team is currently investigating two separate incidents where teenaged females have been contacted by adult males while at San Ysidro High School, or in the vicinity of the school.

On Tuesday, February 11, 2014, at approximately 8:20 a.m., a 17 year old girl was contacted in the 1700 block of Caliente Avenue by a Hispanic male driving a light blue van. The suspect asked the teenager several times to get into his van, but she refused. The suspect in this case is described as a Hispanic male, 30-40 years old with a heavy build. He also had a thick mustache, short black hair, and was wearing a camouflage hat and a cream colored jacket.

On Monday, March 3, 2014, at approximately 7:30 a.m., a female student was approached by a Hispanic male on the high school campus. At first, the male asked the student questions about class times, but then started asking for her name. The student felt uncomfortable and tried to walk away, but the male deliberately blocked her path. Once the male stepped in front of her, the student ran away. The suspect in this case is described as a Hispanic male, 30-35 years old, approximately 5' 11" tall, thin build, with a thin beard. This suspect was wearing a white t-shirt and blue jeans.

At this time, it appears that these cases are unrelated. The investigation is ongoing and citizens are asked to report any suspicious or unusual activity to the San Diego Police Department Southern Division at (619) 424-0400 or San Diego County Crime Stoppers at (888) 580-8477.
