POLICE INVESTIGATE OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTING WITH HOMICIDE SUSPECT IN CITY HEIGHTS

On Thursday, April 16, 2015, at 3:43 a.m., the San Diego Police Department responded to a report of an armed robbery and a customer shot at the “Arco am/pm” gas station, located at 6130 Balboa Avenue. When officers arrived, they located a male victim inside the business suffering from at least one gunshot wound to the chest. The victim, 48 year-old Eric Schade of San Diego, was transported to Sharp Memorial Hospital where he was pronounced deceased.

Within the past 24 hours, investigators identified a potential suspect in the homicide and believed he was in the area of 3800 Winona Avenue. On Friday night, numerous uniformed officers and undercover detectives began a surveillance operation in the area in an attempt to apprehend the suspect.

At 00:49 a.m., the San Diego Police Department received a 911 call of a prowler armed with a handgun attempting to break into several apartments in the complex located at 3810 Winona Avenue. Several officers responded and began a search of the entire complex while gathering additional information on the suspect’s location.

At 2:49 a.m., Two San Diego Police Detectives were going to check for the suspect in the complex community room. As the detectives approached the door, the suspect began shooting through the door, narrowly missing both officers. Both officers returned fire and struck the suspect at least one time in the torso. The suspect surrendered and came out of the community room where he was taken into custody. He was transported to Mercy Hospital for treatment of non-life threatening injuries.

The suspect has been identified as 30 year-old Ahmed Hassan Mumin of San Diego. He is being charged with murder, armed robbery and attempted murder of the two police officers. Once the suspect is released from the hospital he will be booked into County Jail.

The two officers involved in the shooting have been with the San Diego Police Department for 25 years and 12 years respectively.
