Pacific Beach DUI Checkpoint Nets 7 DUI Arrests

On May 8, 2015 the San Diego Police Department conducted a DUI checkpoint in the 2600 block of Ingraham Street in Pacific Beach. The checkpoint was made possible by a California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) "STEP Grant."

The checkpoint was operational from 11:00 pm until 3:00 am. 731 vehicles passed through the checkpoint, with 634 of those motorists being screened by officers. 9 motorists were detained for a further evaluation of their sobriety at the checkpoint, and 7 arrests were made for DUI in or near the checkpoint. 7 vehicle impounds were also conducted.

"The message is simple, ***Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over***. Drinking alcohol and driving do not mix. If you plan to consume alcohol, you should also plan not to get behind the wheel of a vehicle or ride a motorcycle," said Officer Mark McCullough.

The San Diego Police Department recommends these simple tips:

- Plan a safe way home before the festivities begin;
- Before drinking, designate a sober driver and leave your car keys at home;
- If you're impaired, use a taxi, call a sober friend or family member, or use public transportation;
- Report drunk drivers - Call 911; and
- remember, "RUOK?" is a ridiculous question. If you think they've had too much to drink, they probably have. Help him or her make other arrangements to get home safely.

The national ***Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over*** crackdown is led by the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) and NHTSA, with the California Avoid DUI Task Force Campaign, combining high-visibility enforcement and heightened public awareness through publicity.
