The City of San Diego has declared Monday's upcoming football game to be an "Overflow Capacity Event". More than 60-thousand fans are expected to converge at Qualcomm Stadium to see the Chargers and Pittsburgh Steelers face off at 6:00 p.m.

Because it's a night game, traffic is expected to be very congested. The City is asking fans to avoid rush hour traffic by either taking the trolley or carpooling.

Qualcomm Stadium Manager Erik Stover says, "We're encouraging all drivers to arrive at the stadium at least three hours prior to kickoff. All fans will be required to have a valid game ticket to enter the stadium parking facility."

In declaring the game an "Overflow Capacity Event", security procedures will be enhanced to help the traffic flow.

"Monday Night Football is truly a special occasion for the city and our fans," said Jim Steeg, Chargers Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer. "We hope everyone attending the game will give themselves plenty of time to get to the stadium and soak up every minute of excitement surrounding the game."
