## MAYOR JERRY SANDERS FACT SHEET

### MAYOR ANNOUNCES HISTORIC STREETS REPAVING PROJECT

*Might Be Largest Such Project in City's History*

Mayor Sanders announced the beginning of a massive project to perform a complete makeover of 134 miles of the city's most damaged streets – a project of what might be unprecedented scope in city history.

The city will spend roughly \$47 million to resurface more than 1,000 city blocks with asphalt overlay. With this project, the city will perform asphalt resurfacing on nearly as many miles of streets as it did in the previous **eight** fiscal years **combined**.

“Keeping the streets in good condition is one of the most fundamental jobs of city government,” Mayor Sanders said. “I’m enormously proud to kick off a project that will benefit so many people in so many ways.”

Money comes from a \$103 million deferred-maintenance bond reserved for capital-improvement projects, such as storm-drain and building repairs. Given that the cost of repairing the streets would have mushroomed if the city hadn't acted now, this project could produce significant long-term savings.

Asphalt overlay is generally used on streets in very bad condition. Among the streets slated for asphalt overlay are some of the most complained-about roads in San Diego, including the following:

In addition to the 134 miles of asphalt-overlay, the city will be performing slurry-seal resurfacing of an additional 147 miles of roads. That, too, is a figure that might be unprecedented in city history.
