BEN F. SMALL DISCUSSES HIS MOST RECENT BOOK, THE OLIVE HORSESHOE, AT THE SAN DIEGO PUBLIC LIBRARY

A Gritty Story about a Billionaire Searching for Meaning in His Life

SAN DIEGO – The City of San Diego Public Library will host author Ben F. Small, who will read from his new book, *The Olive Horseshoe*, on Wednesday, August 20 at 6.30 p.m. in the Wangenheim Room on the 3rd floor of the Central Library. The library is located at 820 E St. in downtown San Diego. This event is FREE to the public.

In the new book, billionaire Denton Wright is kayaking in the wilderness when his father's mutilated body washes up on the Spanish coast. While investigating his father's death, Wright learns of the "Olive Horseshoe," and is drawn into an intrigue of evil on a global scale. *The Olive Horseshoe* is a fast, tough book about a man on a search for meaning in his life - and the violent brutal events that test him.

An honors graduate from Indiana University and an experienced trial lawyer, Ben F. Small has had over thirty years experience handling complex antitrust, litigation and other legal matters worldwide for Fortune 500 companies. Small was required by his company to travel to the Seattle area, and in 1983, climbed Mount Rainier. *Alibi On Ice*, his first novel, grew out of the plot he considered on the Rainier ascent. Some people climb a mountain "because it is there." Ben F. Small climbed Mount Rainier and came back down with the basis of a mystery novel. He has been able to turn his attention to suspense fiction on a fulltime basis since 2002.
