CENTRAL LIBRARY SCREENS DIGITAL STORIES FROM CRAWFORD HIGH SCHOOL

Refugee Students Produce and Direct Their Own Digital Stories

SAN DIEGO – The City of San Diego Public Library will host a screening of *Refugee Experiences @ Crawford High*, digital stories of refugee students at Crawford High School, in conjunction with the ongoing *One Book, One San Diego* community reading campaign, on Wednesday, April 28 at 6:30 p.m. in the 3rd floor auditorium of the Central Library located at 820 E Street in downtown San Diego. This event is free to the public.

Refugee Experiences @ Crawford High will feature digital stories produced and directed by the students themselves. Refugee students at Crawford High use digital media to share their experiences of being refugees in the United States. The Multimedia and Visual Arts School at Crawford High is a unique learning environment that provides a climate of collaboration and mutual respect focusing on web design, video production and graphic arts.

The *One Book* campaign, sponsored with KPBS, is designed to encourage all San Diegans to read the same book at the same time, and to educate and enlighten on topics and themes of concern to the community. This year's selection is *Outcasts United* by New York Times journalist Warren St. John. Throughout the year the San Diego Public Library and KPBS will present workshops, lectures, discussion groups and TV and radio programming.
