**SAN DIEGO PUBLIC LIBRARY'S FRIDAY TALKING PICTURES FILM
SERIES SCREENS: 5 FILMS BY ALFRED HITCHCOCK**

You Can't Go Wrong with Hitchcock

SAN DIEGO – The San Diego Public Library will screen five cinema masterpieces by legendary filmmaker Alfred Hitchcock every Friday in December at 2:30 p.m. in the 3rd floor auditorium of the Central Library, located at 820 E Street in downtown San Diego. *Friday Talking Pictures* is a world-spanning celebration of contemporary and classic cinema viewed on a wide silver screen. Audience discussions will oftentimes follow the screenings. This event is FREE and open to the public.

December 2nd – *The Birds* – A wealthy San Francisco socialite pursues a potential boyfriend to a small Northern California town that slowly takes a turn for the bizarre when birds of all kinds suddenly begin to attack people there in increasing numbers and with increasing viciousness.

December 9th – *The 39 Steps* – A man in London tries to help a counterespionage agent. But when the agent is killed and he stands accused, he must go on the run to both save himself and also stop a spy ring trying to steal top secret information.

December 16th – *Strangers on a Train* – A psychotic socialite confronts a pro tennis star with a theory on how two complete strangers can get away with murder...a theory that he plans to implement.

December 23rd – *Rebecca* – When a naive young woman marries a rich widower and settles in his gigantic mansion, she finds the memory of the first wife maintaining a grip on her husband and the servants.

December 30th – *The Trouble with Harry* – The trouble with Harry is that he's dead, and everyone seems to have a different idea of what needs to be done with his body.
