Central Library Announces Schedule for Free Fall Concert Series *Hausmann Quartet Will Open with String Quartets by Haydn, Prokofiev and Wolf*

SAN DIEGO – The 2012 Fall Concert Series of the City of San Diego Public Library will begin Sunday, August 26 with a performance by the Hausmann Quartet of popular string quartets by Haydn, Prokofiev, and Wolf. The FREE program will be held at 2:30 p.m. in the third floor auditorium of Central Library, 820 E St., in downtown San Diego.

Che-Yen Chen, principal violist with the San Diego Symphony, will perform a solo recital on September 16. Two Renaissance ensembles will follow—a family-friendly event on September 30 by the lively sextet Courtly Noyse, and an “Autumn Renaissance” program on October 14 by the choral ensemble Pacific Camerata. On October 28, saxophonist Matthew Ennis and friends will give an entertaining program of music from the Baroque to the contemporary period, followed by the final concert of the season on November 18 by the talented Camarada Trio. The Library began its Chamber Music Series in the mid-1950s, shortly after the current Central Library opened in 1954. These concerts are made possible by the Friends of Central Library, the San Diego Public Library matching fund program, and public and private donations.
