About the San Diego Public Library

The San Diego Public Library System serves the residents of the City of San Diego, which encompasses an area of 342 square miles. The Library System consists of the new, iconic Central Library, 35 branch libraries, and the highly acclaimed adult literacy program (READ/San Diego). The Department serves the educational, cultural, business and recreational needs of San Diego's diverse communities through its collection of more than 3.6 million books and audio-visual materials, 3,138 periodical subscriptions, 1.6 million government documents and over 265,000 books in 25 languages other than English. Electronic access is provided to the library catalog and many index and full-text databases in all library facilities and via the Internet. The Library Department's annual budget in fiscal year 2014/2015 is \$46M with approximately 436 full-time equivalent staff members that are diverse, talented, and highly dedicated. The Library's budget for fiscal year 2015 increased due to staff increases for expanded hours and implementation of a new afterschool homework program at 18 libraries.



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
