Jack London (1876-1916), one of the most widely read American writers in the world, is known for stories like *The Call of the Wild* and *The Sea Wolf*, as well as his own adventures as a sailor, Klondike gold-seeker, and rancher. Far less well known is London's work as a photographer, embodied in 12,000 photographs in the Huntington Library. Most have been seen by very few people and have never appeared in print.
