Soldados: Chicanos in Viet Nam

Chicanos in the ranks found themselves uniquely caught in the middle — between blacks and whites, whose clashes dominated the era, and between U.S. society's contradictory views of them as loyal citizens and as alien migrants. The war and post-war experiences of five Chicano soldados from California, shows how the war both exposed and exacerbated America's racial conflicts.

Jorge Mariscal, Ph.D., director of the Chicano/a ~ Latino/a Arts & Humanities program at UCSD, will facilitate a discussion following the screening.
