Set on a chilly, Sunday afternoon, the film's heavy stillness, lack of music, preference for intense close-ups and distancing long shots, and barren setting lead the audience inescapably into the core of a profound silence, an echo chamber in which love can't grow and religion rings hollow. The second of Bergman's faith trilogy, "Winter Light" is probably his most clear minded examination of how a lack of faith can test orthodox religion.

After the screening, Dr. Evelyn Kirkley, a professor of theology and religious studies at the University of San Diego, will facilitate a discussion.

This event is part of "Stories of Faith: Religion and Diversity in San Diego," the Library's five-month series of programs consisting of dance, music, live theater, films, exhibits, lectures and panel discussions with the goal of enabling participants to learn more about each other's beliefs and values.
