**SAN DIEGO** – The City of San Diego Public Library announces that it has a new web address: [www.sandiegolibrary.org](http://www.sandiegolibrary.org). The new web address is easier to remember and simpler to use than the previous one.

“The San Diego Public Library is continually looking for ways to provide better and more efficient services to the public,” said City Library Director Anna Tatár. “We hope that this web address change will prove popular with San Diego residents and that they will find it easier to access the Library’s online services and information.”

The public can perform a variety of tasks and functions on the Library’s web site, including:

- Search the entire Library catalog of 3 million books and other items.
- Reserve books, CDs, videos and other materials with email notification when they’re ready.
- Review your Library Account.
- Renew Library materials.
- Search 70 online databases on a large variety of topics.
- Sign up for the free monthly *Library Connection* newsletter with information about upcoming events.
- Download a Library card application.
- Search for upcoming activities, programs and exhibits on the Calendar of Events.

The Library’s web site is also a wealth of information about services and programs, such as library locations and operating hours, details about contributions and volunteering, assistance for people with disabilities, special announcements, new library construction, and much more.

The Library web pages are among the most popular of the City of San Diego web site. In June 2006, Library web pages received an average of more than 4,000 visitors and more than 5,600 hits per day.
